A Proclamation

I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do required the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison on Thursday, June 30, 1988 at 10:00 A.M. solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:

1. To enact legislation relating to diversion of water for agricultural purposes.
2. To enact legislation relating to providing drought assistance loan guarantees and interest rate reductions on drought assistance loans and making and appropriation.
3. To enact legislation relating to information for farmers on drought relief and making an appropriation.

In testimony whereof I have set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twenty-ninth day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred and eighty-eight.
