To the Honorable the Senate:

1983 Wisconsin Act 27, created s.46.277(5m) of the statutes which requires the Department of Health and Social Services to submit an annual report on its federal Medicaid home and community-based waiver project, the Community Integration Program II (CIIPII). CIIPII is designed to relocated or divert elderly and physically disabled persons from nursing homes into the community. The waiver was approved by the Health Care Financing Administration on December 5, 1985, with a retroactive effective date of January 1, 1985.

The attached report covers calendar year 1987, the third of three federally approved waiver years.

To the Honorable the Senate

Wisconsin Act 27, created section 36.25 (14m), which requires that:

'By November 15, 1988 and annually thereafter, the board shall adopt a recruitment and retention plan for minority and disadvantaged students enrolled in the system. The recruitment and retention plan shall include allocations from the appropriation under section 20.285 (4)(a). By November 15, 1988 and annually thereafter, the board shall submit a report on the recruitment and retention plan under this paragraph to the governor and to the presiding officer of each house of the legislature for referral to the appropriate standing committees under s.13.172 (3).'

Following the Board of Regents action on November 11, 1988, I am transmitting this report on the UW System Recruitment and Retention Plan for Minority and Disadvantaged Students in fulfillment of the requirement under s.36.25 (14m) of the statutes.

In reviewing the November 15 report you will note that the UW System recruitment and retention plan is derived from Design for Diversity, which was adopted by the Board in May, 1988 and is currently in the process of being implemented. Further, some components of the plan incorporate policy goals adopted by the Board earlier in Planning the Future and, therefore, reflect the UW System's ongoing and sustained effort to address the needs of minority and disadvantaged students in the UW System. This plan, consequently, includes not only the UW System's minority and disadvantaged student recruitment and retention goals, but the means devised to ensure progress toward those goals and an identification of the activities now underway. Information regarding the appropriation established for minority and disadvantaged student programming is also included.

Sections 36.34 and 36.44, of the statutes require reports to the Joint Committee on Finance on minority student retention programs and participation in precollege programs, respectively, in October 1986 and 1988. Due to the related subject matter of the October 1988 reports under s. 36.34 and 36.44 and their joint review by the Board, they are being submitted in single document with the November 15 plan.

The challenge of increasing higher education opportunities for minority and disadvantaged students requires a comprehensive strategy and a partnership between state government and educational institutions at all levels. We submit this report in recognition of your interest and support of this important goal.
