Senate Bill 25

Relating to establishing a business improvement loan guarantee program; providing technical assistance and grants to municipalities and tribal governing bodies; development zones; a grant or loan to a manufacturing firm; funding agricultural research and development; tourism promotion; the Wisconsin job opportunity business subsidy program; conservation work projects for American Indian youth; grants to American Indian tribes for drug law enforcement activities; a loan to a bank holding company; spearfishing law enforcement aid and state agency costs for spearfishing; costs of legal services incurred by the department of justice; the authority of wardens of the department of natural resources; the American Indian economic liaison program; providing information and assistance by the department of administration to the American Indian community; grants for home school coordinators; granting rule-making authority; and making appropriations.

RULING OF THE CHAIR

On Tuesday, March 13, 1990, the Senator from the 29th, Senator Chilsen, raised the point of order that in accordance with Senate Rule 93 (5), a motion to table a motion to withdraw a bill from committee was out of order.

The Chair took the point of order under advisement.

Senate Rule 93(5) reads as follows: No motion shall be entertained to postpone action to a day or time certain.

The motion to table does postpone action, however, it does not postpone action until a day or time certain. The purpose of the rule is not to postpone 'definitely.' A motion to table or postpone 'indefinitely' is in order.

Therefore, it is the opinion of the Chair that the point of order raised by the Senator from the 29th is not well taken and the motion to table is properly before the Senate.
