To the Honorable the Legislature:

The University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents at its July meeting adopted the following resolution:

Pursuant to 1989 Wisconsin Act 186, s. 36.12 (3) (a) (b), Wisconsin Statutes (effective April 24, 1990), the board hereby approves and directs that the attached report on the implementation of the Act be submitted to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172 (3).

The reference report is attached. It shows the number of complaints received by each institution broken down by numbers and types of alleged discrimination followed by the disposition of each complaint.

A total of 72 complaints were received during the academic year (1990-91). Of that number 32 have been resolved, 5 were dropped by the student filing the complaint, there was no discrimination found in 10 of the complaints and 25 are pending.

The Board of Regents did not receive any requests for review.
