State of Wisconsin Legislative Audit Bureau

September 27, 1991

To the Honorable the Legislature:

We have completed the financial audits of the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans 1980 Series A Mortgage Revenue Bond Program and Veterans 1981 Mortgage Revenue Bond Program. The audits were requested by the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs to fulfill the annual audit requirements under the bond issues' Indenture of Trust and Bond Resolution. The reports include our independent auditor's report on the financial statements, a report on internal control structure and a compliance report, as of June 30, 1991, and 1990.

We were able to express an unqualified opinion on the financial statements. We found the bond programs have met the requirements of the Indenture of Trust, the Bond Resolution, and the Wisconsin Statutes. The audit reports include no major findings, conclusions, or recommendations and, in our judgement, are not likely to be of interest to most members of the Legislature.
