**EXECUTIVE ORDER #135**

*Relating to a Special Session of the Legislature*

Now, Therefore, I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Tuesday, October 15, 1991 at 10:00 A.M. solely to consider legislation regarding education reform in the following subject areas:

1. Legislation relating to the recommendation of the Commission on Schools for the 21st Century, granting rule-making authority and making appropriations.
2. Legislation relating to statewide pupil achievement tests and making an appropriation.
3. Legislation relating to the pupil minimum competency testing program.
4. Legislation relating to audits of school districts' compliance with the state education standards.

5. Legislation relating to providing assistance to low-performing school districts by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

6. Legislation relating to grants to high-performing or improving school districts and making an appropriation.

7. Legislation relating to contracts for children-at-risk services.

8. Legislation relating to a statewide pupil data base.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this fourteenth day of October in the year one thousand nine hundred and ninety-one.
