# The State of Wisconsin Office of the Governor

#### **Executive Order Number 142**

Relating to expanding a Special Session of the Legislature

I, Tommy G. Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this state, and specifically by Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, Section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Tuesday, April 14, 1992 at 2:30 p.m. solely to consider legislation in the following subject areas:

1. Legislation relating to restricting gambling conducted by the state to the forms of gambling that the state is currently conducting, the forms fo gambling that may be conducted by Indians on tribal lands, background investigations of Indian gaming employes and vendors, simulcasts of horse and dog races from out-of-state racetracks, providing grants for research on or the treatment of compulsive gambling and making an appropriation.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twentieth day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and ninety-two.
