Thompson, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this state, and specifically by Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, Section 4 of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on Tuesday, June 30, 1992 at 10:00 a.m. solely to consider a constitutional amendment relating to distinguishing the state lottery from prohibited gambling, limiting "lottery", prohibiting lottery expansion to other games, and removing from the gambling section of the constitution the prohibition of individual divorce grants by the legislature (first consideration.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twentieth day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and ninety-two.
