Good Morning, Chairperson Ott and committee members. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Assembly Bill 407. This bill will authorize the Veterinary Examining Board to conduct physical, mental and professional competency examinations of credential holders subject to a disciplinary investigation or proceeding when indicated. **The Department and Veterinary Examining Board supports AB 407.** The Department thinks the changes proposed in AB 407 will be helpful to the board in carrying out its statutory enforcement responsibilities. AB 407 gives the Veterinary Examining Board the same authority that the Medical Examining Board has for its credential holders that are subject to disciplinary investigations or proceedings by the board.

We are asking for your support and favorable vote on Assembly Bill 407. Again, thank you for this opportunity to comment on this legislation.

Good Morning Chairman Ott and members of the Assembly Committee on Agriculture.

I am J.A. Hines. I am a general veterinary practitioner from Oxford, Wisconsin. I am here today as a member of the Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board who wishes to testify regarding Assembly Bill 407. The Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board requested that this legislation be introduced on behalf of the Board and the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

The entire Board is in support of this proposed legislation and urge the members of the committee to support the passage of Assembly Bill 407.

This bill will give the Veterinary Examining Board the same power and ability as the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board currently has in that it will allow the Board to require a credential holder who is being investigated or prosecuted for unprofessional conduct to submit to a physical, mental or professional competency examinations if the Board believes that such examination would be useful to the Board in carrying out its duties of consumer protection.

As the Veterinary Profession has progressed and as the Board deals with more complicated complaints and investigations the Board feels that it needs this investigative tool.

We urge the committee to support this piece of legislation and I thank the members of the committee for allowing me to testify on behalf of the Board.
