

DRAFTER'S NOTE FROM THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU

Monday, March 23, 1998

To Representative Schneider:

I have drafted this bill in preliminary form, because I lack information about all of the following:

1. How much in general purpose revenues should be appropriated for 1998-99 for the immunizations?

2. In addition to the persons specified in the bill, you might want to include volunteer emergency management workers (described under s. 166.03 (8) (d), stats.) and persons who provide equipment or services under the direction of the governor, the adjutant general or the head of emergency management services in any county, town or municipality during a state of emergency declared by the governor (as described in s. 166.03 (10), stats.). The obvious problem with including these people, however, is that, unless an emergency arises, it is difficult to ascertain who, specifically, they are. Are there any other persons that you might want to include?

3. I have provided that DHFS must establish procedures for distributing the immunization money by rule. Do you want DHFS to do this under emergency rule-making procedures, without requiring a finding of emergency, to speed up the rule making?



AN ACT *to* amend 20.435 (5) (cm) (title); and *to* create 20.435 (5) (cn) and 252.043 of the statutes; **relating to:** immunization of certain persons against anthrax and granting rule-making authority

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill establishes a program in the department of health and family services (DHFS) that provides general purpose revenues to pay for immunization from anthrax, an infectious disease that may be caused by inhalation of airborne spores from animal products. Persons who would be eligible under the program for the immunization are emergency medical technicians, first responders, law enforcement officers, certain emergency management personnel and others as specified by rule by DHFS.


