

The bill also prohibits a telecommunications provider from using a customer's social security number for the same purpose. In addition, the bill allows the public service commission, on its own motion or the filing of a complaint by any person, to commence an action in court to enforce the bill's prohibitions. A telecommunications provider who violates the bill's prohibitions is subject to a forfeiture of between \$25 and \$5,000.

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

Please review this bill, which is based on 1997 LRB–1290/1, very carefully to make sure that it achieves your intent. In addition, please note the following differences between this bill and 1997 LRB-1290/l:

- 1. After reviewing 1997 LRB-1290/l, I thought the provisions of this bill should more appropriately be included in s. 196.209, which deals with privacy considerations.
- 2. This bill, unlike 1997 LRB-1290/l, includes provisions to ensure that commercial mobile radio service providers, alternative telecommunications utilities and providers of cable television service are subject to the bill's prohibitions. Note that telecommunications carriers are also subject to the bill's prohibitions by virtue of s. 196.499 (1) (b), stats.
