1. Page 1, line 10: after "statements;" insert "authorizing the activation of the national guard for public disasters related to the year 2000 computer issues;"

2. Page ⁵8, line ¹⁰4: after that line insert:

"SECTION 5r. 21.11 (1) of the statutes is renumbered 21.11 (1) (a).

6

SECTION 5s. 21.11 (1) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

21.11 (1) (b) 1. In this paragraph "electronic computing device" means any computer hardware or software, computer chip, embedded chip, process control equipment, or other information system used to capture, store, manipulate, or process information, or that controls, monitors, or assists in the operation of physical apparatus that relies on automation or digital technology to function.

2. In anticipation of, or in the event of, a public disaster resulting from the failure of an electronic computing device to process, transmit or receive data data

1 from, into and between the 20th and 21st centuries, and during the years 1999 and
2 2000, and from leap year calculations, the governor may order into active service all
3 or any portion of the national guard. If the governor is absent, or cannot be
4 immediately communicated with, the commanding officers of any national guard
5 company, battalion or regiment may, upon approval of the adjutant general, if the
6 danger is great and imminent, order out that officer's command to respond to the
7 public disaster. The order shall be delivered to the commanding officer, who shall
8 immediately communicate the order to each, and every subordinate officer. Every
9 company commander receiving an order under this paragraph shall immediately
10 communicate the substance of that order to each member of the company, or if any
11 member cannot be found, a notice in writing containing the substance of the order
12 shall be left at the last and usual place of residence of the member with some person
13 of suitable age and discretion, to whom its contents shall be explained. This
14 paragraph does not apply after December 31, 2000."✓
