	The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
7	SECTION 1. 20.435 (4) (bc) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9,
8	is amended to read:
9	20.435 (4) (bc) Health care for low-income families. As a continuing
10	appropriation <u>Biennially</u> , the amounts in the schedule for the badger care health care
11	program for low–income families under s. 49.665.
12	SECTION 2. 20.865 (4) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

1	20.865 (4) (d) Badger care health care program supplement. A sum sufficient
2	to supplement the appropriation under s. 20.435 (4) (bc) as provided in 1999
3	Wisconsin Act (this act), section 4 (b).
4	SECTION 3. 20.865 (4) (d) of the statutes, as created by 1999 Wisconsin Act
5	(this act), is repealed.
6	SECTION 4. Nonstatutory provisions.
7	(1) BADGER CARE SUPPLEMENT.
8	(a) The joint committee on finance may transfer in the 1999–2001 fiscal
9	biennium appropriated moneys from the general purpose revenue appropriation
10	account of any state agency, as defined in section 20.001 (1) of the statutes, other than
11	a sum sufficient appropriation account, to the appropriation account under section
12	20.435 (4) (bc) of the statutes to supplement the badger care health care program for
13	costs of increasing enrollment and changing the rates of reimbursement paid to
14	health care providers if the committee finds that the transfer will eliminate
15	unnecessary duplication of functions, result in more efficient and effective methods
16	for performing programs or more effectively carry out legislative intent, and that
17	legislative intent will not be changed by the transfer.
18	(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) and sections 13.101 (3) and (4) and 20.003

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(4) of the statutes, from the appropriation under section 20.865 (4) (d) of the statutes,
the joint committee on finance may supplement in the 1999–2001 fiscal biennium the
appropriation to the department of health and family services under section 20.435
(4) (bc) of the statutes to supplement the badger care health care program for costs
of increasing enrollment and changing the rates of reimbursement paid to health
care providers if the committee determines that appropriated moneys are

insufficient to supplement the appropriation account under s. 20.435 (4) (bc) as
 provided under paragraph (a).

3 SECTION 5. Effective dates. This act takes effect on the day after publication,
4 except as follows:

5 (1) The repeal of section 20.865 (4) (d) of the statutes takes effect on July 1,
6 2001.
