2 FACULTY AND ACADEMIC STAFF PAY ADJUSTMENTS. Notwithstanding section 16.505 (4) (b)
3 of the statutes, for employes who are eligible to receive compensation adjustments
4 under section 230.12 (3) (e) of the statutes, the board of regents of the University of
5 Wisconsin System may use moneys appropriated under section 20.285 (1) (im) of the
6 statutes to pay for the compensation adjustments approved under section 230.12 (3)
7 (e) of the statutes for the 1999-2001 fiscal biennium, but only up to an amount that
8 equals the difference between the amount that the University of Wisconsin System,
9 under section 20.928 (1) of the statutes, certifies is needed under section 20.865 (1)
10 (ci), (d), (ic) and (j) of the statutes to fully fund the compensation adjustments and
11 the amount that the secretary of administration determines is required under

15 of the University of Wisconsin System shall submit to the joint committee on finance
16 for its approval a plan for the construction and operation of the aquaculture
17 demonstration facility authorized under SECTION 9107 (1) (i) 3. of this act that
18 includes all of the following:

- 19 (a) A description of the physical characteristics of the facility.
20 (b) The facility's functions.
21 (c) How and by whom the facility's functions will be carried out.
22 (d) The number of persons necessary to staff the facility.
23 (e) The facility's estimated, annual operating cost.

1 ***b0520/2.2*** (2e) STUDY AND REPORT ON HEALTH CARE AID GRANT PROGRAM. The
2 department of veterans affairs shall review the health care aid grant program and
3 examine program modifications that could restrain the expenditure growth of the
4 program. No later than December 31, 1999, the department shall submit a report
5 presenting the results of the review and examination, including any program
6 changes that the department believes should be made in the program, to the joint
7 committee on finance.

9 **Center Authority.**

10 **SECTION 9157. Nonstatutory provisions; workforce development.**

11 ***-0702/9.9157*** (1) COMMUNITY YOUTH GRANT. Notwithstanding section 49.175
12 (1) (vL) of the statutes, as created by this act, the following organizations shall
13 receive the following grant amounts from the moneys allocated under section 49.175
14 (1) (vL) of the statutes, as created by this act, without participating in a competitive
15 process:

16 (a) The Wisconsin chapters of the Boys and Girls Clubs of America, \$1,300,000
17 in each fiscal year of the 1999–2001 biennium.

18 (b) The Silver Spring Neighborhood Association, \$75,000 in each fiscal year of
19 the 1999–2001 biennium.

20 (c) The Safe and Sound initiative in Milwaukee, \$1,000,000 in fiscal year
21 1999–2000 and \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2000–2001.

22 (d) Wisconsin Good Samaritan Project, Inc., \$125,000 in each fiscal year of the
23 1999–2001 biennium.

24 (e) The Youth Leadership Academy, Inc., and the United Community Center,
25 \$500,000 in each fiscal year of the 1999–2001 biennium.

1 (f) The Milwaukee Passports for Youth Program, \$150,000 in each fiscal year
2 of the 1999–2001 biennium.

3 *~~1922/5.9157~~* (2) GOVERNOR'S WORK-BASED LEARNING BOARD.

4 (a) *Assets and liabilities.* On the effective date of this paragraph, the assets and
5 liabilities of the department of workforce development primarily related to the
6 functions of the division of connecting education and work, as determined by the
7 secretary of administration, shall become the assets and liabilities of the governor's
8 work-based learning board.

9 (b) *Employee transfers.* On the effective date of this paragraph, all positions in
10 the department of workforce development that are primarily related to the division
11 of connecting education and work and the incumbent employees holding those
12 positions, as determined by the secretary of administration, are transferred to the
13 governor's work-based learning board.

14 (c) *Employee status.* Employees transferred under paragraph (b) have all the
15 rights and the same status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the
16 statutes in the governor's work-based learning board that they enjoyed in the
17 division of connecting education and work in the department of workforce
18 development immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4)
19 of the statutes, no employee so transferred who has attained permanent status in
20 class is required to serve a probationary period.

21 (d) *Tangible personal property.* On the effective date of this paragraph, all
22 tangible personal property, including records, of the department of workforce
23 development that is primarily related to the functions of the division of connecting
24 education and work, as determined by the secretary of administration, is transferred
25 to the governor's work-based learning board.

1 (e) *Pending matters.* Any matter pending with the department of workforce
2 development on the effective date of this paragraph that is primarily related to the
3 division of connecting education and work, as determined by the secretary of
4 administration, is transferred to the governor's work-based learning board. All
5 materials submitted to or actions taken by the department of workforce development
6 with respect to the pending matter are considered as having been submitted to or
7 taken by the governor's work-based learning board.

8 (f) *Contracts.* All contracts entered into by the department of workforce
9 development in effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily
10 related to the functions of the division of connecting education and work, as
11 determined by the secretary of administration, remain in effect and are transferred
12 to the governor's work-based learning board. The governor's work-based learning
13 board shall carry out any obligations under those contracts unless modified or
14 rescinded by the governor's work-based learning board to the extent allowed under
15 the contract.

16 (g) *Rules and orders.* All rules promulgated by the department of workforce
17 development in effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily
18 related to the division of connecting education and work remain in effect until their
19 specified expiration date or until amended or repealed by the governor's work-based
20 learning board. All orders issued by the department of workforce development in
21 effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily related to the division
22 of connecting education and work remain in effect until their specified expiration
23 date or until modified or rescinded by the governor's work-based learning board.

24 ***b0540/1.1*** (2c) TERMINOLOGY IN REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS. The department of
25 workforce development shall amend its request for proposals for administration of

1 Wisconsin works for the period beginning January 1, 2000, and ending December 31,
2 2001, to do all of the following:

3 (a) *Definition of “entered employment transaction”*. Define the term “entered
4 employment transaction” under the job retention performance criterion.

5 (b) *Full and appropriate engagement*. Modify the “full and appropriate
6 engagement” criterion by doing all of the following:

7 1. Specifying that “full and appropriate engagement” with respect to an
8 individual who is required to participate in the food stamp employment and training
9 program means engagement in required activities for an amount of time equal to the
10 individual’s household’s monthly food stamp benefit divided by the minimum wage.

11 2. Eliminating the provision that specifies that “full and appropriate
12 engagement” with respect to participants in Wisconsin works employment positions
13 means engagement in appropriate activities for at least 30 hours per week.

25 within the 1999–2001 fiscal biennium, the division of vocational rehabilitation

1 submits to the secretary of workforce development a plan to reorganize the division,
2 the secretary may not approve the plan unless the plan includes provisions to reduce
3 supervisory staff, convert vacant supervisor positions to rehabilitation counselor
4 positions for regions with high caseloads, and convert program assistant supervisor
5 positions to support positions to provide additional support for rehabilitation
6 counselors.

7 ***b0583/4.6*** (2p) ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. On the effective date
8 of this subsection, those portions of any contract entered into by the department of
9 workforce development that relate to the administration of medical assistance, that
10 are in effect on the effective date of this subsection, remain in effect and are
11 transferred to the department of health and family services. The department of
12 health and family services shall carry out any contractual obligations that relate to
13 medical assistance under those contracts until the contracts expire or are modified
14 or rescinded to the extent permitted under the contracts.

15 ***b0569/1.17*** (2xt) TRANSITION TO FEDERAL WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT OF 1998.

16 (a) *Council on workforce investment.*

17 1. 'Functions.' During the period beginning on the effective date of this
18 subdivision and ending on June 30, 2000, all functions of the governor's council on
19 workforce excellence under the federal Job Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501
20 to 1798, shall continue as the functions of the council on workforce investment
21 established under 29 USC 2821.

22 2. 'Members.' All members of the governor's council on workforce excellence
23 who are serving in that capacity on the day before the effective date of this
24 subdivision shall continue that service as members of the council on workforce

1 investment established under 29 USC 2821, unless the governor appoints members
2 to replace those members.

3 (b) *Local workforce development boards.*

4 1. 'Functions.' During the period beginning on the effective date of this
5 subdivision and ending on June 30, 2000, all functions of a private industry council
6 that is established under the federal Job Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501 to
7 1798, for a service delivery area designated under 29 USC 1511 shall continue as the
8 functions of the local workforce development board that is established under 29 USC
9 2832 for the identical local area designated under 29 USC 2831.

10 2. 'Members.' All members of a private industry council that is established
11 under the federal Job Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501 to 1798, for a service
12 delivery area designated under 29 USC 1511 who are serving in that capacity on the
13 day before the effective date of this subdivision shall continue that service as
14 members of the local workforce development board that is established under 29 USC
15 2832 for the identical local area designated under 29 USC 2831, unless the governor
16 appoints members to replace those members.

17 3. 'Assets and liabilities.' On the effective date of this subdivision, the assets
18 and liabilities of a private industry council that is established under the federal Job
19 Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501 to 1798, for a service delivery area
20 designated under 29 USC 1511 shall become the assets and liabilities of the local
21 workforce development board that is established under 29 USC 2832 for the identical
22 local area designated under 29 USC 2831.

23 4. 'Tangible personal property.' On the effective date of this subdivision, all
24 tangible personal property of a private industry council that is established under the
25 federal Job Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501 to 1798, for a service delivery

1 area designated under 29 USC 1511 is transferred to the local workforce
2 development board that is established under 29 USC 2832 for the identical local area
3 designated under 29 USC 2831.

4 5. 'Pending matters.' Any matter pending with a private industry council that
5 is established under the federal Job Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501 to 1798,
6 for a service delivery area designated under 29 USC 1511 is transferred to the local
7 workforce development board that is established under 29 USC 2832 for the identical
8 local area designated under 29 USC 2831. All materials submitted to or actions
9 taken by that private industry council with respect to a pending matter are
10 considered as having been submitted to or taken by that local workforce development
11 board.

12 6. 'Contracts.' All contracts entered into by a private industry council that is
13 established under the federal Job Training Partnership Act, 29 USC 1501 to 1798,
14 for a service delivery area designated under 29 USC 1511 that are in effect on the
15 effective date of this subdivision remain in effect and are transferred to the local
16 workforce development board that is established under 29 USC 2832 for the identical
17 local area designated under 29 USC 2831. That local workforce development board
18 shall carry out any obligations under such a contract unless the contract is modified
19 or rescinded by the local workforce development board to the extent allowed under
20 the contract.

21 ***b0582/1.1*** (3e) UNIFIED PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY. The department of workforce
22 development, in coordination with the departments of health and family services and
23 public instruction, shall develop a proposal and implementation plan for a simplified
24 and unified application process for medical assistance under subchapter IV of
25 chapter 49 of the statutes, badger care under section 49.665 of the statutes, the food

1 stamp program under 7 USC 2011 to 2036, the school lunch program under section
2 115.34 of the statutes and the supplemental food program for women, infants and
3 children under section 253.06 of the statutes. Not later than July 1, 2000, the
4 departments shall submit the proposal and implementation plan to the joint
5 committee on finance. If, within 14 days after receiving the proposal, the
6 cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the departments that the committee
7 has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposal and
8 implementation plan, the departments shall implement the proposal in accordance
9 with the implementation plan. If, within 14 days after receiving the proposal and
10 implementation plan, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the departments

12 implementation plan, the departments may not implement the proposal except as
13 approved by the committee.

2 liabilities of the higher educational aids board primarily related to the functions of
3 the educational approval board, as determined by the secretary of administration,
4 shall become the assets and liabilities of the department of veterans affairs.

5 (b) *Employe transfers.* All incumbent employes holding positions in the higher
6 educational aids board performing duties primarily related to the functions of the
7 educational approval board, as determined by the secretary of administration, are
8 transferred on the effective date of this paragraph to the department of veterans
9 affairs.

10 (c) *Employe status.* Employes transferred under paragraph (b) have all the
11 rights and the same status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the
12 statutes in the department of veterans affairs that they enjoyed in the higher
13 educational aids board immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section
14 230.28 (4) of the statutes, no employe so transferred who has attained permanent
15 status in class is required to serve a probationary period.

16 (d) *Tangible personal property.* On the effective date of this paragraph, all
17 tangible personal property, including records, of the higher educational aids board
18 that is primarily related to the functions of the educational approval board, as
19 determined by the secretary of administration, is transferred to the department of
20 veterans affairs.

21 (e) *Contracts.* On the effective date of this paragraph, all contracts entered into
22 by the higher educational aids board that are in effect on the effective date of this
23 paragraph and that are primarily related to the functions of the educational approval
24 board, as determined by the secretary of administration, remain in effect and are
25 transferred to the department of veterans affairs. The department of veterans

1 affairs shall carry out any such contractual obligations until modified or rescinded
2 by the department of veterans affairs to the extent allowed under the contract.

3 *b0607/3.18* (7tw) SPECIAL TRANSFER AID REPORT.

4 (a) By May 1, 2000, the board of school directors of the school district operating
5 under chapter 119 of the statutes shall submit a report to the joint committee on
6 finance for its approval under paragraph (b). The report shall include all of the
7 following:

8 1. A strategy for achieving the percentages specified under section 121.85 (6)
9 (am) of the statutes, as created by this act.

10 2. A facility plan specifying the neighborhood schools that are needed, the
11 location of specialty schools and the estimated cost of the facility plan.

12 3. Other means by which the pupil capacity of neighborhood schools will be
13 expanded, which could include remodeling and use of nontraditional facilities.

14 4. Specific plans for establishing neighborhood schools and replicating or
15 relocating specialty schools throughout the school district in order to increase the
16 number of pupils attending neighborhood schools.

17 5. A description of the alternative settings, which are in compliance, as defined
18 in section 115.33 (1) (a) of the statutes, that will be used for educating pupils.

19 (b) The joint committee on finance shall review the report under paragraph (a)
20 and may modify the report. The committee shall approve the report, and any
21 modifications to the report, by September 1, 2000.

22 (c) Notwithstanding section 121.85 (6) (ar) of the statutes, as created by this
23 act, the department of public instruction may not distribute any aid under section
24 121.85 (6) (ar) of the statutes, as created by this act, to the board of school directors
25 of the school district operating under chapter 119 of the statutes in the 2000–01 fiscal

1 year until the report is approved by the joint committee on finance under paragraph
2 (b).

3 ***b0388/1.1*** (7x) TRUST LANDS IN TAX INCREMENTAL DISTRICT; GOVERNOR'S
4 CONCURRENCE.

5 (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), the governor may not concur with the
6 determination of the U.S. secretary of the interior, as described in 25 USC 2719 (b)
7 (1) (A), that a gaming establishment on land acquired by the secretary in trust for
8 an Indian tribe after October 17, 1988, would not be detrimental to the surrounding
9 area if the land on which the gaming establishment is located, or is proposed to be
10 located, is in a tax incremental district.

11 (b) The prohibition on concurrence under paragraph (a) does not apply if the
12 governor determines that appropriate arrangements have been made to ensure that
13 the life of the tax incremental district described in paragraph (a) will not be extended
14 for a greater number of years than the district would have existed if the land on which
15 the gaming establishment is located, or is proposed to be located, were not part of the
16 tax incremental district.

21 consultation with instructors and other staff from law enforcement training
22 academies. The department of justice and the department of natural resources shall
23 jointly prepare a written report of their review and shall submit the report to the
24 cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for consideration at the 2nd

1 quarterly meeting of the committee under section 13.10 of the statutes in the year
2 2000. The report shall include recommendations concerning all of the following:

3 (a) Using the Roll Call Law format of the department of justice to produce an
4 environmental law enforcement training video for distribution to law enforcement
5 agencies and law enforcement training academies.

6 (b) Developing an environmental law enforcement training seminar for
7 presentation at regional training events.

8 (c) Producing an environmental law enforcement training presentation in
9 optical disk or electronic format.

10 (d) Using techniques of distance education, as defined in section 24.60 (1g) of
11 the statutes, to provide environmental law enforcement training.

12 (e) Funding any environmental law enforcement training proposals under
13 paragraphs (a) to (d) using law enforcement training funds from the department of

18 (a) Notwithstanding section 62.23 (1) (c), 1997 stats., an alderperson, village
19 board member or town board member who is elected by his or her colleagues in April
20 1999 to serve on a city, village or town planning commission under section 62.23 (1)
21 (b), 1997 stats., may serve on the planning commission until April 2000.

22 (b) A citizen member of a city, village or town planning commission who is
23 appointed under section 62.23 (1) (c), 1997 stats., may serve on the planning
24 commission until the expiration of the term to which he or she was appointed.

25 **SECTION 9201. Appropriation changes; administration.**
