Summary

Reclassify sex offender registrations specialists (corrections program specialist) positions from general classification status under WRS to protective classifications status under the WRS, effective on the January 1 after enactment of the budget bill. These positions in DOJ were eliminated in a budget reduction and new positions were created when this function was transferred to DOC. It is my understanding that in DOJ these were special agent positions which are considered law enforcement officers and thus are under protective occupation. There are currently four sex offender registration specialists in the state. The Governor's budget added two more positions, there are a total of six people with this title.

Fiscal Impact

Under DOA fringe benefits guidelines for the 1999-01 biennium, this would increase the fringe benefit rate for these positions from 37.76% to 41.56%. Based on the salaries of current employees, costs for Corrections would increase by \$7,992 GPR annually.
