Summary

Under current law, a municipality may issue a restaurant a "Class C" wine license under the following conditions: (a) the sale of alcohol beverages accounts for less than 50% of gross receipts; (b) the restaurant does not have a barroom; and (c) there is not a "Class B" license available in the municipality. Even if a restaurant initially issued a "Class C" license, the restaurant must be issued a "Class B" license if such a license is available at the annual renewal date.

The motion would authorize a municipality to issue a "Class C" wine license even if a "Class B" liquor license were available in the municipality. In addition, the amendment would authorize the issuance of a "Class C" wine license to a restaurant with a barroom, as long as the only intoxicating liquor in the barroom was wine.

Fiscal Impact

According to the Legislative Fiscal Bureau, there is no fiscal impact.

Statement of Intent

Revenue. Provide that a restaurant may obtain a "Class C" license for the retail sale of wine for consumption on the premises where sold, whether or not there is a "Class B" license for the sale of liquor and wine available in the community. Provide that a restaurant with a barroom in which wine is the only intoxicating liquor sold would not be precluded from obtaining a "Class C" license.
