Statement of Intent DHFS. This motion restores indirect GME payments to instate hospitals.

Summary Total direct and indirect graduate medical education (GME) payments were \$22.2 million (all funds) in 1997-98. In 1997-98, GME payments were made to approximately 30 Wisconsin hospitals and approximately 15 out-of-state hospitals. GME payments are intended to provide funding to support the training of providers that will serve MA recipients and/or practice in areas of the state that have a shortage of health care providers.

The Joint Committee on Finance adopted the Governor's recommendations to: (a) reduce indirect GME payments to instate hospitals; and (b) eliminate direct and indirect GME payments to out-of-state hospitals. The Committee decreased MA benefits funding by \$1,139,200 GPR and \$1,625,700 FED in 1999-00 and \$1,521,200 GPR and \$2,207,200 FED in 2000-01 to reflect the estimated cost savings of these proposals.

The WisconCare program provides primary health care services to under- and unemployed persons through an organized network of medical providers. The program supports basic health services, including routine physician visits, outpatient diagnostic and laboratory services, inpatient maternity care and prescription medication to eligible individuals. WisconCare is supported by a combination of state funding and professional services donated by providers. State support for the program is provided through an assessment on hospitals that generates a total of \$1,500,000 annually.

The Joint Committee on Finance provided \$1,500,000 PR annually for the WisconCare program.

This motion restores the current level of funding for the Medicaid supplement for indirect GME payments to instate hospitals, maintaining the JFC action to eliminate GME funding for out-of-state hospitals. The Medicaid appropriation would receive \$1.5 million from the WisconCare appropriation in the biennium; \$750,000 in each year. The WisconCare program appropriation would retain \$750,000 in each year of the biennium. The WisconCare program would continue to exist for the current recipients who do not qualify for BadgerCare. [The hospital assessment would be collected in both years of the biennium to fund WisconCare (\$1.5 million) and GME (\$1.5 million) Beginning July 1, 2001, the WisconCare program appropriation would be \$750,000 in each year of the biennium.

The motion requests a Legislative Council Study Committee to explore alternative funding sources for GME.

Fiscal Impact The motion would increase federal revenue by \$2.25 million. Note that the motion was amended to specify a \$300,000 increase in the spending authority under the WisconsinCare program and the funding be taken from their reserves.
