Summary Each W2 agency contract provides that any funding in excess of that used for W2 benefits and other allowable expenses is to be distributed as bonuses according to a formula developed by DWD. Under the latest request for proposals (RFP) issued by DWD, W2 agencies will be required to meet certain performance criteria in order to receive the bonuses. Agencies must meet the base standard in order to contract as a W2 agency in the subsequent year. Agencies meeting the second and third standards will be eligible for performance bonuses. Currently, the first performance bonus is 4% of the total contract amount for restricted use bonuses (i.e. community reinvestment). The second performance bonus is 3% of the total contract amount for unrestricted use.

JFC adopted an amendment that takes the funding for the 4% restricted use bonuses away from the W2 agencies and would distribute the funding to counties in accordance with DWD rules on community reinvestment. The county Board will determine the use of the community reinvestment funds.

The amendment would maintain the 4 percent (restricted) bonus for counties in the second performance level and move 1 percent of the unrestricted bonus for W-2 agencies into the second performance level with the remaining 2 percent unrestricted for W-2 agencies in the third performance level.

Fiscal Impact According to LFB, this amendment would save about \$2,779,800 in TANF funds over the biennium.

*Note: In general, all W2 agencies are operated by the counties, except in Milwaukee County where there are five private W2 agencies (four are non-profit, one is for profit). As a result, this motion will not change the bonus recipient for county run W2 agencies.

Fiscal Impact

According to LFB, this amendment would save about \$2,779,800 in W-2 funds over the biennium.
