EQUAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANTS

CN 2303

DESCRIPTION

This amendment would establish a sum-certain per capita supplemental grant to school districts that meet all of the following criteria: (a) The school district had an enrollment in the previous school year of fewer than 500 pupils; (b) The school district is at least 200 square miles in area; and (c) At least 65% of the real property in the school district is exempt from taxation under s. 70.11, owned by or held in trust for a federally recognized American Indian tribe or owned by the federal government.

EXPLANATION/JUSTIFICATION

Several school districts in northern Wisconsin are experiencing extreme financial problems under the equalization aid formula. These districts, such as Laona, have a very small student population base and a disproportionately large geographical service area. In many cases students are already riding the bus for more than an hour each way to and from school. Because of the size of these districts, consolidation (the typical answer to such a dilemma) is not viable. As a result, these districts are not able to offer an equal educational opportunity to the larger districts given the benefit of the economies of scale.

LFB Summary of Governor's Budget Recommendations, Page 505, Item 2

Governor: Prohibit a public school from commencing the school term prior to September 1, beginning in 2001. Specify that this provision would not prohibit a school board from: (a) holding athletic contests or practices before September 1; (b) scheduling in-service days or work days prior to September 1; or (c) holding school year-round. Provide that these provisions would also apply to MPS.

Senator Breske: Given the ever-increasing demands on Wisconsin families and the difficulties they face in finding quality time together, expanding the summer tourism season by as little as two weeks offers a tremendous opportunity for families to spend additional time together. Establishing a uniform school start date after September 1, is also estimated to increase tourism revenues in our state by more than \$66 million while simultaneously generating approximately \$11 million in tourism-related revenue for our local governments.
