**Motion:**

Move to amend JFC Motion #992 in the following way:

- Delete language in the budget bill that requires DHFS, when drafting HMO contracts, to establish penalties for HMOs that do not meet the performance standard.
- Require the Department of Health and Family Services to develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Division of Public Health and Division of Health Care Financing for the purpose of sharing data on lead poisoning screening and preventive services.
- Require as a part of the MOU that the Division of Public Health determine which children at risk in the MA/HMO program between ages of 3-5 have not received lead screening and report that information to the Division of Health Care Financing and the participating HMO so that a screening test can be done.
- Require DHFS to report to the standing committees of each house as to the extent which the goals of the HMO contract for 0-24 month lead screening has been done.

caucus motion regarding MA HMO Childhood Lead Screening

Lance,

Apparently there may be some confusion in Senator Moore's motion to modify an amendment that passed in Finance which set standards for childhood lead screening. Under the last bullet of the caucus motion, DHFS is required to report to the standing committees of each house as to the extent which the goal in the HMO contract (which specifies that 65% of enrolled children ages 0-24 months) have had lead screenings.

To clarify, this requirement takes the place of the lead screening performance standard for 0-5 year olds in the original motion that passed in Finance.
