I'm still thinking on this, but I wanted to get you some information. In 2000-01, schools with existing SAGE contracts (under 118.43(3)(a) and (am)) would receive \$2,000 per low-income pupils enrolled in grades kindergarten to 3. DPI would then subtract the amount needed to fund the existing contracts from the (2)(cu) and (cv) appropriations. The funding remaining in the appropriation would then be distributed to eligible schools that applied for the third wave of contracts as follows: each school would receive \$2,000 per low-income pupil participating in the program (i.e. in 2000-01, \$2,000 for K and 1st grade students, in 2001-02 \$2,000 for K, 1st and 2nd grade students, etc.) to the limit of available funding. DPI would be required to promulgate a rule to fund those schools with the highest poverty rates with available funds.

### Example:

DPI determines there are 25,000 low-income pupils in participating in current SAGE contracts.  
DPI determines funding for those students at \$2,000, the maximum.  
DPI allocates \$50,000,000 of the funding in (2)(cu) and (cv) for existing contracts.  
There remains approximately \$8.75 million in those appropriations.  
For the third round of contracts, schools that have applied list a total of 5,000 additional students for total funding of \$10,000,000. These schools have poverty rates between 90% and 20%.  
Because there is insufficient moneys to fund all applicants for the third wave, DPI would then rank by the schools by poverty rate and fund as many schools as it can at \$2,000 per pupil.  
Under this situation, DPI may only be able to funds schools with a poverty rate of 30% and more.

Lonnie, I have a couple changes related to the SAGE draft.

1. We need to add the following position authority language for a total of 3.0 positions.

Page 127, line 9: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 1999-00 by \$112,800 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2000-01 by \$131,400 to increase the authorized FTE positions for the department of public instruction by 2.0 positions for the program under section 118.43(8) of the statutes.

2. Because contracts under the SAGE program run with schools rather than districts and because the first wave of contracts will end on 2000-01, I think we would need the following changes in section 2107m of the draft. I was also concerned that the language "distributes the amount appropriated to as many school districts as possible" may conflict with giving priority to the schools with the highest poverty rates.

Section 2107m. 118.43(6)(b) 6. 7. and 8. of the statutes are created to read:

118.43(6)(b) 6. In the 2000-01 school year, \$2,000 multiplied by the number of low-income pupils enrolled in grades eligible for funding in each school in the school district covered by contracts under sub. (3)(a) and (am). After making these payments, the department shall pay school districts on behalf of schools that are covered by contracts under sub. (3)(ar), giving priority to schools that have the highest percentage of low-income pupil enrollment, an amount equal to \$2,000 multiplied by the number of low-income pupils enrolled in grades in each school eligible for funding and shall also ensure that it fully distributes the amount appropriated.
