

Subject: Legislation for introduction by Law Revision Committee

I am requesting the following legislative change to be included with the Law Revision Committee's proposal for the upcoming legislative session.

In the 1997 Legislative Session, a mistake was introduced inadvertently in 1997 Act 220, the so-called "date rape" law. Specifically, the name "gamma-hydroxybutyrolactone" is incorrect. The word should read: "gamma-butyrolactone." The change needs to be made in both Sec. 961.14 (5)(ag) and 961.41 (3g)(f).

These changes were discussed at the most recent meeting of the Controlled Substances Board. It was agreed that the change was needed, but purely technical in nature. No fiscal effect is expected from this change.

It was also suggested to me by David Stute to attempt to have this change made as a technical budget amendment for the next biennium. I plan on proceeding along that path as well.

This bill

NOTE: Insert after SECTION 22 Changes the drug name gamma-hydroxybutyrolactone to gamma-butyrolactone. Gamma-hydroxybutyrolactone is a chemical that is not being abused nor is likely to be abused. Gamma-butyrolactone is a chemical which is used in the manufacture of gamma-hydroxybutyrate and gamma-hydroxybutyric acid and is also a drug in its own right. Listing gamma-butyrolactone in the statutes will enable prosecution of offenses involving this drug.
