### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, under the volunteer health care provider program, certain health care professionals may provide without charge diagnostic tests, health education, information about available health care resources, office visits, patient advocacy, prescriptions and referrals to health care specialists.

This bill permits certified dietitians to provide services under the volunteer health care provider program.

practical nurse or nurse-midwife under ch. 441, optometrist under ch. 449 or
physician assistant under ch. 448 or certified as a dietitian under subch. V of ch. 448
and who receives no income from the practice of that health care profession or who
receives no income from the practice of that health care profession when providing
services at the nonprofit agency specified under sub. (3).

### **SECTION 2. Effective date.**

(1) DIETICIANS AS VOLUNTEER HEALTH PROVIDERS. This act takes effect on February 1, 1999, or on the day after publication, whichever is later.
