

**Brief Description of Intent:**

The proposed changes will make chapter 43 consistent with 1997 WI Act 150

**Related Stat. Citations:**

Repeal s. 43.24(2)(f), (h), (j), (L), and(m), Wis. stats., and recreate s. 43.24 (2) (L) and (m), Wis. stats.

**DESCRIPTION OF CURRENT LAW AND PROBLEM:**

1997 Wisconsin Act 150 was enacted on April 20, 1998. The law is the culmination of the work done by a special legislative study committee on public libraries, and makes various changes to chapter 43 of the statutes. Some of these changes make parts of the chapter redundant or unnecessary.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

- ✓ Repeal s. 43.24 (2) (f), Wis. stats. S. 43.24 (2)(fm) added by 1997 Wis. Act 150 makes this provision unnecessary.
- ✓ Repeal s. 43.24 (2) (h), Wis. stats. S. 43.24 (2)(e) modified by 1997 Wis. Act 150 makes this provision unnecessary.
- ✓ Repeal s. 43.24 (2) (j), Wis. stats. This planning requirement is unnecessary because of the planning requirement under s. 43.17(5) and s. 43.24(2)(i), which allows a library system to provide other service programs. (2)(i)
- A Repeal and recreate s. 43.24 (2) (L) to require public library systems to provide agreements with other types of libraries or multitype library organizations in the system area for the appropriate sharing of library resources to benefit the clientele of all libraries in the system area. The revised language should focus on the most important part of the requirement, the agreements, and eliminates the requirement for a separate plan.
- A Repeal and recreate s. 43.24 (2) (m), to clarify that a separate plan for library technology and resource is required, and that it should be developed at least once every five years. A separate plan in this highly specialized area is necessary.
