Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

SB 136 requires health plans offering coverage to state employees through the Group Insurance Board to provide coverage for appropriate and necessary immunizations for dependents from birth to age two. Required immunizations include: diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, hemophilus influenza B and hepatitis B.

Currently, all health plans offered to state employees provide coverage for the listed immunizations. Therefore, the Department has no fiscal effect associated with the bill.
