

1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 965

1 **AN ACT relating to:** ratification of the agreement negotiated between the state
2 of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin State Employees Union, AFSCME Council 24,
3 and its appropriate affiliated locals, AFL-CIO, for the 1999-01 biennium,
4 covering employes in the professional social services collective bargaining unit,
5 and authorizing an expenditure of funds.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

6 **SECTION 1. Agreement ratified.** The legislature ratifies the tentative
7 agreement negotiated for the 1999-01 biennium between the state of Wisconsin,
8 department of employment relations, and the Wisconsin State Employees Union,
9 AFSCME Council 24, and its appropriate affiliated locals, covering employes in the
10 professional social services collective bargaining unit under subchapter V of chapter
11 111 of the statutes, as approved by the employes of the professional social services

1 collective bargaining unit and approved and recommended by the joint committee on
2 employment relations, and authorizes the necessary expenditure of moneys for
3 implementation from the appropriations made by section 20.865 (1) of the statutes,
4 subject to section 20.865 (intro.) of the statutes. The secretary of employment
5 relations shall file an official copy of the agreement, certified by the cochairpersons
6 of the joint committee on employment relations, with the secretary of state. No
7 formal or informal agreement between the parties which is not a part of the official
8 copy is deemed to be approved by the legislature under this act.

9 **SECTION 2. Effective date.**

10 (1) This act takes effect on the day following publication, except that those
11 provisions specifically identified as having other effective dates in the agreement
12 covering employes in the professional social services collective bargaining unit are
13 effective on the dates provided in that agreement.
