Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

Currently all bills that contain a penalty (criminal or financial) provision are exempt from the fiscal estimate process. This bill would repeal the statute so all bills that contain penalty provisions must have a fiscal estimate attached.


The additional amount of fiscal estimates that DOA might receive under this bill would be handled by existing FTE, and DOA would absorb the added duties within existing base resources.
