Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This fiscal estimate is limited to the estimated impact of this bill on this Bureau and on the Assembly and the Senate. It is estimated that this bill would have no fiscal impact on the operations of this Bureau. Some additional bills might be referred to the Joint Committee on Finance as a result of this new requirement, but the additional workload associated with any required analyses of those bills could be absorbed by existing staff. The only estimated fiscal impact on the Assembly and the Senate would be associated with the preparation and publication of these additional fiscal estimates which are currently not required. A separate fiscal estimate prepared by the Legislative Reference Bureau identifies the estimated increased workload costs on that agency. The LRB fiscal estimate also contains an estimate of the additional cost that would be incurred by the legislative documents sum sufficient appropriation for the added printing costs associated with an increase in the number of fiscal estimates that would be published annually. That cost was estimated by the LRB to total about \$4,100 GPR annually.
