Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill creates a plea and verdict of "guilty but mentally ill" for persons charges with a homicide offense. Enactment of this bill could increase costs to the Department of Justice if appeals increase due to the use of this plea and the manner in which it is used.

According to the Department of Corrections, this bill may affect as few as 2 individuals per year. However, their appeals and their treatment plans may increase costs to the state, but our department is unable to predict those costs at this time.
