Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits any person, including public agencies, from disclosing any personal information about or obtained from a person under 18 years of age for commercial or trade purposes without the prior written consent of the parent or guardian of a child. We do not anticipate a significant fiscal impact to the Department as a result of this bill; however, there may be minimal administrative costs associated with obtaining written parental consent and sending the information to the parent prior to disclosing any personal information if such a situation would arise where the Department had to disclose personal information. It is estimated that any local government costs would also be minimal or none.

The Department of Workforce Development does not disclose any personal information for commercial or trade purposes. However, we do disclose information requested under the Open Records Law that may contain personal information that identifies a child or child's immediate family or guardian by name. For example, in cases filed with the Equal Rights Division regarding labor standards, if a minor is the complainant or an affected party, certain information is available to the public upon request as an open record. However, information that might be injurious to an affected party (social security number, birth date, home address, phone number, pay rate, etc.) is not disclosed. We do not receive a significant number of these requests. Also, information on minors may be disclosed for purposes of vocational rehabilitation of an individual; however, this is not disclosed without a signed release from the minor and legal guardian. Personal information may also be disclosed to other state agencies, the federal government, local government partners or contracted service providers such as in the case of identifying students eligible for the free/reduced lunch program.

Other personal information on minors that is maintained by the Department is only disclosed for purposes of administering the program according to state and/or federal law. Personal information is not disclosed to the public or for commercial or trade purposes under these programs, but may be disclosed to state and/or federal agencies, local government partners and parties to a case (i.e. Worker's Compensation, Equal Rights, Child Support).
