Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

1997 Wisconsin Act 283 (the "truth in sentencing" act) provided for changes to felony penalties and to the structure of felony sentences. This act concerned offenses committed on or after December 31, 1999.

This bill eliminates the changes made by WI Act 283. Since these changes were not scheduled to take effect until the end of 1999, the department has had no experience with the law's fiscal impact.

Thus it is not possible to estimate the fiscal impact of this legislation.
