

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SUMMARY OF BILL - - Under current law, a person may receive a permit from the Department of Natural Resources to hunt with a crossbow if the person has suffered a disability affecting certain upper extremities and is unable to use a bow and arrow. The disability involves a permanent substantial loss of function in one or both hands, arms and shoulders. The disability is certified by a physician after having failed a standardized strength test. Under this proposal, a person would not have to take a standardized strength test to be eligible for a permit if the physician certifies in writing that the person is physically unable to hunt with a bow and arrow.

FISCAL IMPACT - Currently the Department receives 2000 applications annually for crossbow permits. Approximately 550 of the applications do not meet eligibility requirements currently set forth in statute. The Department anticipates considerably more applications as a result of this proposal. We estimate the number of applications will double as a result of these provisions because standards are lowered. The Department will face an additional 600 hours of staff time statewide to review and issue crossbow permits. These additional hours may be offset because the time taken to issue a permit will be reduced for all crossbow permits because of the lowered standards of issuance. Therefore the Department can handle this proposal within its current appropriation.

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
