If enacted, this bill would only increase District Attorney workload in locations where there is no municipal court. Further it is not known which and how many municipalities without municipal courts would enact such an ordinance. Most of the larger cities in Wisconsin have municipal courts. The expectation therefore is that it would result in only a very small number of additional DA cases.


