Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate


This bill provides various additional restrictions on the sale or transfer of ownership of handguns. Further, the bill makes it a misdemeanor crime to violate any of the restrictions created in the bill. Because the bill creates a new crime, it's possible that enactment of the bill would increase costs to the State Public Defender's Office (SPD). Because it is not known how many people would be charged with this new crime or, of those charged, how many would qualify for SPD representation, the SPD cannot estimate the costs at this time.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Costs are indeterminate at this time. Agency would monitor fiscal effect of bill, if enacted, for future budget considerations.
