Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this legislation all complaints regarding the transfer of no charge 800# telephone calls to 900# toll calls will be referred to the Department of Justice (DOJ). All phone companies will be required to notify customers each month to contact DOJ with complaints. DATCP and PSC would also be required to forward complaints to DOJ. It is assumed that five (5) complaints per day will be received for a total of 1290 per year. It is further estimated that 90% of complaints received can be resolved through mediation by a consumer aid. The remaining 10% (130) will require follow-up investigation. It is anticipated that 5-10 prosecutions per year will result from this workload which can be absorbed by DOJ. If the estimation of prosecutions is greater, DOJ will require additional resources.
