EXECUTIVE ORDER #383

Relating to a Special Session of the Legislature

I, **Tommy G. Thompson**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Article IV, Section 11 and Article V, Section 4 of the Wisconsin Constitution, do hereby require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in the City of Madison, beginning at 3:00 p.m. on October 27, 1999 solely to consider and act upon legislation relating to:

creating a tax rebate for individuals,
repealing the school property tax rent
credit, reducing the amount that is

available under the school levy tax credit
and making an appropriation.
