

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board proposes an order to amend NR 10.01 (1) (v) and repeal and recreate NR 10.01(1) (b), (g)1.a. to k., (g)2., (g)3., (u)1., and (u)2., relating to the 1999 migratory game bird season.

The proposed rules establish the regulations for the 1999 migratory game bird season. The significant regulations are:

Ducks. The state is divided into two zones each with 60-day seasons. The season in the southern duck zone begins at noon October 2 and continues for 60 days, closing November 30. The north duck zone season begins at noon October 2 and continues through November 30. The daily bag limit in both zones is 6 ducks, including four mallards, of which only one may be a hen, and one canvasback for the entire 60 days in both zones.

Canada Geese. The state is apportioned into 3 goose hunting zones: Horicon, Collins and Exterior. Other special goose management subzones within the Exterior Zone include Brown County, Burnett County, New Auburn, Rock Prairie and the Mississippi River. Season lengths are: Collins Zone - 68 days; Horicon Zone - 86 days; Exterior Zone - 21 days; and Mississippi River Subzone - 70 days. The Burnett County and New Auburn subzones are closed to Canada goose hunting.

The special youth waterfowl hunt event will be expanded to include non-resident youth hunters with hunter education certificates or the equivalent certification from another state or province.

SECTION 2. NR 10.01(1)(v) is amended to read:

NR 10.01(1)(v) Special youth waterfowl hunt event. Persons 12 years of age or older but under 16 years of age who possess a certificate of accomplishment under s. 29.591, Stats., or its equivalent from another state or province, may hunt all species of wild duck, mergansers, geese, coots and gallinules on the 14th day before the opening of the regular duck season. Approvals under ch. 29, Stats., are not required pursuant to s. 29.197(1), Stats., except for registration in the harvest information program under s. NR 10.12(11) and a Canada goose hunting permit, if hunting Canada geese. Daily bag limits are those described under s. NR 10.01(1)(b), (c) and (g) and all other waterfowl hunting regulations apply. Hunters shall be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older. One adult may not accompany more than 2 hunters.

The foregoing rules are approved and adopted by the Natural Resources Board on _____, 1999.

The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.

Statement of Need

The proposed rules establish the regulations for the 1999 migratory game bird season. The significant regulations are:

Ducks – The state is divided into 2 zones each with 60-day seasons. The season in both duck zones begins at noon October 2 and continues through November 30. The daily bag limit in both zones is 6 ducks, including 4 mallards and one canvasback for the entire 60 days in both zones.

Canada geese – The state is apportioned into 3 goose hunting zones: Horicon, Collins and Exterior. Other special goose management subzones within the Exterior Zone include Brown County, Burnett County, New Auburn, Rock Prairie and the Mississippi River. Season lengths are as follows:

Collins Zone	68 days
Horicon Zone	95 days
Exterior Zone	94 days
Mississippi River Subzone	80 days
Burnett County	Closed
New Auburn	Closed

The youth waterfowl hunt rule has been amended to allow nonresident youth to participate. The baiting rule has been amended to be consistent with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service rules.

Modifications as a Result of Public Hearing

The table of the open and closing hours for migratory game bird hunting was amended to show the hours for the month of January. The baiting rule was amended to be consistent with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service rules. The map of the Mississippi River subzone was repealed and recreated to show the new name of the railroad that serves as the eastern border of the Mississippi River subzone.

Other changes in season and bag limits were made as a result of the final framework from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.



The proposed rules establish the regulations for the 1999 migratory game bird season. The significant regulations are:

The north duck zone season begins at noon October 2 and continues through November 30. The daily bag limit in both zones is 6 ducks, including 4 mallards, of which only one may be a hen, and one canvasback for the entire 60 days in both zones.

Canada Geese. The state is apportioned into 3 goose hunting zones: Horicon, Collins and Exterior. 

The emergency rule procedure, pursuant to s. 227.24, Stats., is necessary and justified in establishing rules to protect the public welfare. The federal government and state legislature have delegated to the appropriate agencies rule-making authority to control the hunting of migratory birds. The State of Wisconsin must comply with federal regulation in the establishment of migratory bird hunting seasons and conditions. General regulations are not made available to this state until mid-August of each year. This order is designed to bring the state hunting regulations into conformity with federal regulations. Normal rule-making procedures will not allow the establishment of these changes by September 1. Failure to modify our rules will result in the failure to provide hunting opportunity and continuation of rules which conflict with federal regulations.
