Dear Sen. Wirch and Rep. Vrakas,

The State Engineering Association has very strong reservations about enacting AB 800-SB 412 based on the likely negative impact these bill may have on the Wisconsin Retirement System.

The major proposed AB 800 change to s. 13.093 (2) (a), State Stats., is to delete the requirement: "The joint survey committee on retirement systems shall prepare the fiscal estimate with respect the provisions of any bill referred to it which created or modify any system for the retirement of or payment of pensions to public officers or employes."

We strongly object to the above change and deletion of this statutory requirement of Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems. The State Engineering Association asks what will replace the current independent authority to objectively evaluate fiscal aspects of legislative bills affecting the Wisconsin Retirement System?

The current system works, so why replace it? If it must be changed, give the director and the Joint Survey Committee stronger authority to be politically detached, rather than eliminate the director position and office as AB 800 proposes. If this bill goes forward an amendment is needed to assure that the continuity of both the staff and the work of the Joint Survey Committee office will be preserved.

The integrity of the Wisconsin Retirement System must be adequately protected by law. We do not want the security of the system dependent on the good will of the legislature. It must be secured by statute because as state employees our daily lives and fiscal well being dependent on it.

# Testimony of THE WISCONSIN RETIRED EDUCATORS' ASSOCIATION (WREA) Hal Rebholz, WREA Legislative Chair Jane Elmer, WREA Executive Director Economic Development, Housing and Government Relations Monday, March 6, 2000 417 North

RE: Opposition to AB 800/SB 412

(The elimination of the authority of the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems (JSCRS) to employ a research director and staff; elimination of the requirement to prepare an estimate for any bill referred to it that creates or modifies any retirement system for public employees.)

We are testifying on behalf of the Wisconsin Retired Educators' Association (WREA) and our 11,500 members to express our opposition to AB 800/SB 412.

Retirement research is complex, and any change to the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) needs careful, complete and INDEPENDENT review. We support the current system of employing a director and staff for the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems (JSCRS). This maintains the independence of the JSCRS and the Retirement Research Committee (RRC).

As they were designed, the combined work of the JSCRS and the RRC provide for a thorough and impartial study of retirement issues. This process needs to happen apart from the politics that can embroil the legislature. Maintaining this independence is not only a good practice but also a responsible one.

To be without a director of the RRC and the JSCRS at this critical time is unfortunate. Rather than taking a quick way out by combining the work of the RRC and JSCRS into the work of the Legislative Council, we support hiring a new director who has a strong focus on public policy. We believe that the hiring a new director should be a top priority.

Our position has always been that retirement bills must have a thorough review that includes public hearings and financial analysis. To eliminate the requirement for fiscal estimates is irresponsible.

In Wisconsin, we have one of the best--if not THE BEST--retirement systems in the country. WREA views AB800/SB 412 as risking the future of the WRS. Approving AB 800/SB 412 might solve the immediate problem of what to do with the committee, but ultimately this "one step forward would be two steps back."

### SB 412/AB 800

These two companion bills were introduced last week by Co-Chairs Senator Wirch and Representative Vrakas to change the administration of the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems and the Retirement Research Committee. I have enclosed an analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau for your review. I would highly recommend that everyone attend the hearing scheduled for March 6, 2000, at 11:00 a.m. in room 417 North, at the Capitol and express your opposition.

This bill eliminates the research director and staff. Then requires the Legislative Council to provide staff to assist JSCRS and RRC. There appears to be no provision for public hearings on retirement bills and the retirement committee may no longer operate independently from the Legislative Council.

5. The current annual appropriation for the operations of the Retirement Research Director's office is \$212,800 for fiscal year 2000-01. Thus, the net fiscal effect of assigning this function to the Legislative Council Staff would be an annual savings of \$165,300 GPR (excluding one-time costs for furniture and equipment).
