TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL 48 TO SENATE COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, HOUSING AND GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS April 14, 1999

Thank you for the opportunity to present information concerning the expansion of the state's itemized deductions credit by allowing casualty and theft losses to be included in the calculation of the credit.

Federal law allows taxpayers a subtraction from federal adjusted gross income (AGI) for itemized deductions when they exceed the federal standard deduction, and Wisconsin allows a credit for some of those federal itemized expenses. The Wisconsin itemized deductions credit is equal to 5% of the eligible itemized deductions in excess of Wisconsin's standard deduction, and the overall credit cost Wisconsin approximately \$269 million in FY98.

Under current Wisconsin law, casualty and theft losses can not be used in the calculation of the itemized deduction credit. However federal law allows filers to include casualty and theft losses in excess of \$100 as an itemized deduction if the sum of the losses exceeds 10% of federal AGI. The federal treatment of casualty and theft losses recognizes that those losses are unexpected and can substantially reduce the ability to pay taxes for some taxpayers.

SB 48 would expand the state's itemized deductions credit by allowing casualty and theft losses to be used in the calculation of the itemized deduction credit.

This change would affect less than 1,000 of Wisconsin's 2.5 million taxfilers and the department estimates that it would result in a GPR revenue loss of approximately \$330,000 annually. The committee should be aware that targeting tax provisions to such a small group of filers may result in more complex tax forms and instructions for all taxpayers.

Senator Wirch, Committee Members, thank you for this opportunity to submit testimony on behalf of Senate Bill 48, relating to the itemized deductions credit.

For the past few summers, resident in my district and all across Wisconsin have suffered the tremendous affects of mass flooding. The flooding has been relentless, causing millions of dollars in personal property damages and losses. Many families, in fact, have lost their entire homes and possessions.

Current law provides for the listing of such casualty losses on one's federal itemized deductions credit. Inclusion of these items on an individual's state list, however, is not allowed.

My proposal would allow individuals that have suffered financially as a result of flooding and similar casualties to include their losses on their itemized deductions credit. Not only would this bring our state tax code into line with the federal code, it will also give those that have already suffered some remedy for their losses.
