Kim:

Wanted to follow-up with our luncheon discussion from last week as well as try out the communications channel.

Sen. Wirch and I talked briefly regarding our discussion items. I was happy to get his involvement. He has already talked to Chancellor Keating regarding UW-P's involvement in some type of small business forum. Looking at Spring for this. We will talk again after the holidays.

I have not been able to talk to Vince Ruffalo as of yet, we keeping missing each other.

I also mentioned our discussion to Peter Barca. He is very supportive and will assist when needed.

I have been giving much thought to your question of what does the 3-5 year old company need the most. Here is what I came up with:

- 1) Recognition - It seems that there is considerable assistance for the business start-up thru the SBA, and other econ. dev. entities. Larger companies also get attention from government when they need something. However it seems that the 3-5 yr. old that is still "on-the-bubble" is shied away from. Even private consultants shy away from them because they usually don't have alot of expendable money.
- 2) Organizational Capacity Building - Skills necessary to address growth pains and long-term survival. These skills are different from start-up capability.
- 3) Long-term advocacy - Assistance in maintaining growth & survival programs in continuous integrated cycles. Traditionally this group has implemented only piecemeal survival tactics in chaotic order.

It will take place at the Student Union, in Room 207, at 10:00 a.m.

Committee members include Senator Gwen Moore, D-Milwaukee, Senator Rick Grobschmidt, D-Milwaukee, Senator Gary Drzewiecki, R-Pulaski, and Senator Dave Zien, R-Eau Claire.

Senator Moore is also a member of the Joint Finance Committee. This is especially relevant because Sen. Wirch's committee will be making recommendations to the JFC based on the input received from this forum.

The focus of the committee that day will be on the biennial budget bill (Senate Bill 45/Assembly Bill 133) and its effect on economic development, small business and housing issues.

Deputy Secretary Phil Albert of the Department of Commerce will make a presentation.

There will also be a presentation by Executive Director Fritz Ruf of the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority. WHEDA provides loans for low- and moderate-income housing, as well as small business and agricultural development projects. The authority finances most of its programs through the sale of federally tax-exempt bonds that are not an obligation of the State of Wisconsin.

Members of the public are invited to testify on these and/or any other issues.
