CAREER SYNOPSIS OF WILLIAM B. HARVEY

William B. Harvey is Dean of the School of Education at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. During his career in higher education of more than 25 years, Dr. Harvey has also held faculty and administrative appointments at North Carolina State University, the State University of New York at Stony Brook, the University of Pennsylvania, Richard Stockton College (NJ), Earlham College (IN), and Brookdale Community College (NJ). He received his bachelor's degree in English from West Chester University (PA). His master's degree in Social Foundations of Education and his doctoral degree in Anthropology of Education were both earned at Rutgers University.

Harvey's administrative experiences have been in the areas of academic affairs, research administration, and student affairs, with a special focus on interdisciplinary research, international programs, student advising, and academic support services. His research and scholarly activity has been focused on the cultural and social factors that affect African American populations, with particular emphasis on college and university settings. Recently he served as the cluster evaluator for a project sponsored by the W. K. Kellogg Foundation, in which \$30 million dollars was invested in ten Historically Black Colleges and Universities to develop Centers of Excellence.

His latest book, *Grass Roots and Glass Ceilings: Commentaries from African American Administrators in Predominantly White Universities* is scheduled to be published by the State University of New York Press later in 1998. He is also co-author of *Affirmative Rhetoric, Negative Action*, and co-editor of *New Directions for Community Colleges: Recruiting and Retaining Minority Faculty*, and he has published in a variety of professional journals and popular publications, including: *The Journal for Higher Education Management*, *The Urban League Review*, *Education and Urban Society*, *The Journal of Drug Issues*, *The Journal of Black Studies*, *The Journal of Negro Education*, *The Humboldt Journal of Social Relations*, *The Journal of Educational Technology Systems*, *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, *Change*, *Academe*, and *Black Issues in Higher Education*. He is a member of the Editorial Board for the *Review of Higher Education* and the *Negro Education Review*, and a Consulting Editor for *Change: the Magazine for Higher Learning*.
