Re: Clearinghouse Rule 99-149

Date: February 14, 2000

Clearinghouse Rule 99-149 was referred to the Senate Committee on Human Services and Aging on February 8, 2000. This rule is being proposed by the Psychology Examining Board.

Under current rules, an applicant for licensure as a psychologist or school psychologist may sit for the examinations required by the board an indefinite number of times.

Under the proposed rule, once a person has taken and failed an examination on three occasions, the person would be required to receive permission from the board before taking the exam again. The person would also be required to demonstrate to the board that he or she has received further remedial education or training which in the opinion of the board addresses those areas in which the applicant has shown weakness.

The medical examining board has had a similar rule since 1976.

State law provides that the Committee on Human Services and Aging has 30 days in which to review this proposed rule. If you would like the committee to hold a public hearing on this rule, please let me know by Thursday, February 24, 2000.
