A proposal I have introduced, Assembly Bill 205, has been referred to the Senate Committee on Judiciary and Consumer Affairs. I introduced this legislation at the request of a juvenile judge in my district. Now that the budget has passed and we can move onto other issues, it is my hope that you will schedule a public hearing on this legislation.

A juvenile judge in my district heard a trial in which a juvenile was charged with selling a dangerous weapon to a minor. The juvenile admitted to police that he sold a switchblade knife to a schoolmate. The judge was able to find the juvenile delinquent for having possessed a switchblade but was forced to dismiss the charge of sale of a dangerous weapon because of the inadequacy in state law. This bill addresses the inadequacy.
