Promotional Examinations

This bill expands the eligibility of certain employees of cities of the first class to take general promotional examinations if they are otherwise eligible to take such examinations. This includes all members of the fire and police departments and all exempt city employees who are not subject to the general rules of civil service. This bill would not apply to officers who are elected by the people, one deputy in each department whose office was created by statute, heads of principal departments and certain appointees of the mayor. Currently, fire and police personnel (civilian and uniformed) are hired through the separate civil service procedures of the Fire and Police Commission and includes nearly 3,400 employees. There are approximately 344 employees who are classified as exempt.

History

AB 314 was introduced by Representative John La Fave in the 1997-98 legislative session. The bill received a hearing in the Assembly Labor and Employment Committee but an executive session was not held prior to the conclusion of the session.

General City Exempt Positions

- Two basic types of "exempt" positions: (1) those employees whose jobs are specifically exempted from civil service by state statute and include elected officials, members of boards and commissions and the Mayor's cabinet (121 positions); and (2) those employees who are exempted from civil service by action of the Board of City Service Commission (223 positions of which 167 are full-time and 56 are either part-time, seasonal or student interns).
- Positions can be classified as exempt from request of the appointing authority as to whether it is in the public interest and advantageous to waive civil service requirements. The CSC has exempted positions under the following conditions: (1) immediate staffs of elected officials where political and philosophical compatibility and personal loyalty are critical; (2) unique job skills are required; or (3) the position is funded with non-city funding.
- Appointing authorities may select, by whatever method, any person they desire for an exempt position. Exempt employees serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority and cannot appeal discipline or dismissal to the CSC.

Benefits of Legislation

- Current rules inhibit opportunities for city employees to seek advancement or career changes.
- Restricts the ability of managers to consider employees for advancement, including women and minorities.
- Obstructs the placement of employees into other jobs who are either duty disabled or affected by staffing changes.
- Results in a waste of readily available talent in a job market that is and will increasingly yield fewer trained and experienced persons.
- Results in higher personnel costs through expenses associated with turnover and by the funneling of injured employees into non-productive and costly disability entitlement programs due to the lack of other employment opportunities.
- Fiscal benefit by increasing the pool of internal candidates rather than engaging in an expensive and time-consuming competitive examination.
