

68

1     **Relating to:** the life and public service of Delmar E. DeLong.

2             Whereas, Delmar E. DeLong was born on June 7, 1931, in Beloit, Wisconsin,  
3     and died on June 30, 1999, in Ocala, Florida; and

4             Whereas, Mr. DeLong was educated in Clinton schools, received a B.B.A. from  
5     the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1952, and earned a law degree from the  
6     University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1966; and

7             Whereas, Mr. DeLong served in the U.S. Army from 1953 to 1955; and

8             Whereas, Mr. DeLong served on the Clinton Village Board from 1958 to 1960,  
9     on the Clinton School Board from 1967 to 1973 (serving as its president from 1968  
10    to 1973), on the CESA 17 Board of Control from 1971 to 1973; and

11            Whereas, he served as municipal justice for the Town of Turtle from 1967 to  
12    1975; and

13            Whereas, Mr. DeLong served in the Wisconsin assembly from 1973 to 1982,  
14    where he was elected minority caucus chairman in the 1975 through 1981 sessions;
