Becky,

A new DATCP drafting request.

We will be combining two appropriations in DATCP:

20.115 (1) (a) General program operations (specifically, numeric 105
trade and consumer protection)
20.115 (1) (c) Automobile repair regulation

The intent is not to change any regulatory functions, merely to pay for
automobile repair regulation out of (1) (a).

NOTE: if I understand our budget office procedures correctly, LRB will
receive a table showing the changes to ch. 20 under the budget
adjustment bill. That table will probably show the two appropriations
persisting separately but with reduced expenditure authority. The total
expenditure authority for (1) (a) and (c) shown in that table will be
correct (barring typos) but the appropriations should be combined.

I expect the total authority for the new (1) (a) to equal \$9,085,000 in
FY02 and \$8,619,900 in FY03.

I attach a spreadsheet showing how I got there in case you're
interested.

Under current law, DATCP has a general program revenue appropriation for general program operations related to food safety and consumer protection. DATCP also has a general program revenue appropriation for regulation of automobile repair businesses. This bill eliminates the separate appropriation for regulation of automobile repair businesses.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 SECTION 1. 20.115 (1) (c) of the statutes is repealed.

This draft eliminates s. 20.115 (1) (c), the automobile repair regulation appropriation. Your instructions indicate that there will be a separate table showing changes to the ch. 20 schedule and that it will show both appropriations [(1) (a) and (c)]. We are going to have to be careful to ensure that the two pieces end up being consistent. This may be especially difficult if we end up with related provisions in more than one bill. Also, what we at the LRB will be interested in is how much appropriations should be changed, rather than what the resulting expenditure authority will be. The budget adjustment bill will contain nonstatutory appropriation changes rather than a new schedule. Let me know if you want to see an example of what an appropriation change provisions looks like.
