Tim,

I think this pretty much covers it. If you have questions feel free to call me, or you can also call John Dyck at Fiscal Bureau.

1. Draft language eliminating the requirement that motor vehicles have front license plates.
2. Require that the savings from the remainder of this fiscal year be used to keep open the 48 Department of Motor Vehicle offices selected for closing by the Department of Transportation. Any remaining savings in year 1 would lapse to the General Fund.
3. Require that, in the second year of the biennium, funds from the savings would be used to continue to fund the operation of the 48 DMV offices. In addition, require that one-time funding in the amount of \$500,000 be used to help pay for safety renovations on Lombardi Avenue and any applicable streets adjacent to Lambeau Field.
4. Require that any additional savings be lapsed into the General Fund.
5. Require that future funding be used to fund the 48 rural DMV offices with remaining funds lapsed into the General Fund.

Tim,

I spoke with Jon Dyck last Friday. He understood that Hansen wanted to cut the DMV appropriation by the amount saved from the single plate minus the amount DMV needs to keep open these 48 service centers. Jon calculated this total as \$74,000 this year (FY 01-02) and \$878,200 in FY 02-03. This assumes passage in March. Jon also said the DMV wants a delayed effective date of 2-3 months. Jon said that a delayed effective date would not really impact his calculations. If DMV doesn't have to issue 2 plates, it will stop issuing 2 plates even if it could issue 2 plates and even if it has 2 plates in stock.

I drafted the DMV closure part of this, at least partly. I am spinning my wheels on this draft and have decided to set it aside and talk to you about it Monday if you have time. I am leaving the materials on your desk in case you want to review them before hand. The materials include the insert I drafted, which isn't much. I also attached a "highway rest area" closure draft that I prepared for the budget (the idea was somewhat similar, but I'm not sure if the draft is helpful for copying purposes here or not).

I hope your time away from the office was good. It's been busy around here but the boat, drifting with the tide, has not capsized yet. Langston has a dr. apptment early monday morning but hopefully I'll see you by mid-morning on Monday. Aaron

I think that in 2003-04 there is no lapse requirement (at least not yet), and so they shouldn't have any problem keeping the centers open. In the meantime, we'll have a biennial budget for 2003-05, in which the Legislature can establish the funding that it wants for the DMV. So, while the transfer language in 2003-04 could have the "minus the costs to keep the centers open" provision, I think it shouldn't be necessary, since that amount would already be in the appropriation base. For what its worth, that's the extent of my knowledge that I can impart on this problem.

2002-03 is currently covered in the draft by an appropriation change provision decreasing (5) (cq) by \$878,200, with a "new" one-year appropriation for the \$500,000 for Lombardi Avenue. But, as my (alleged) mind thinks about it, that doesn't leave \$\$\$ in (5) (cq) for keeping open the DMV centers.

So... maybe this will work. Still go with fund transfer beginning in 2002-03. In 2002-03, the DOA secretary transfers savings realized minus the sum of \$500,000 and, as determined by the secretary, the additional costs required by keeping DMV centers open. Then in 2003-04, DOA secretary transfers savings realized *minus* the additional costs required to keep DMV centers open, as determined by the secretary. What do you think, great seer? Thanks as always for your help.

Under current law, the department of transportation (DOT) issues two registration plates for most motor vehicles. The owner of the motor vehicle is required to display one plate on the front of the vehicle and one plate on the rear of the vehicle.

~~Now~~ This bill directs DOT to issue only one registration plate for each motor vehicle. With limited exceptions, the registration plate must be displayed on the rear of the motor vehicle.



Under current law, DOT employs operator's license examiners at local examining centers to perform duties that are related to license examining. This bill prohibits DOT from closing any local examining center and requires DOT to reopen (and not to close in the future) any previously closed local examining center that was in operation on July 1, 2001.

The bill also requires DOT to award grants totaling \$500,000 in January 2003 to Brown County, the city of Green Bay, and the village of Ashwaubenon on a proportionate basis for the costs of the CTH "VK"/Lombardi Avenue project in the city of Green Bay.

Finally, the bill requires the secretary of administration to transfer from the transportation fund to the general fund an amount in each fiscal year equal to the savings realized in the change to a single registration plate for motor vehicles. In fiscal year 2002-03, the amount to be transferred is reduced by the sum of \$500,000 (the total amount of grants created by the bill) and the amount of additional costs incurred by DOT with respect to local examining centers,
