4           (b) The committee shall have the following duties: to gather information  
5 relating to state and local needs for surface transportation programs, including state  
6 highways, transit, local roads, passenger rail including commuter rail, and bicycle  
7 and pedestrian transportation; to involve the participation of relevant groups,  
8 including those with interests in all relevant transportation modes, local and state  
9 government, the environment, transportation program users, persons with  
10 disabilities, and private businesses; to assess potential future long-range funding  
11 needs for surface transportation programs up to a 20-year planning horizon or 2020;  
12 to develop a recommended multiprogram state surface transportation investment  
13 plan, including funding; and to prepare a report containing the committee's  
14 evaluation, findings, and recommendations. Not later than October 15, 2002, the  
15 committee shall submit the report to the governor and to the legislature in the  
16 manner provided under section 13.172 (2) of the statutes.

17           (c) The committee shall hold its first meeting no later than 28 days after the  
18 effective date of this paragraph and shall select a chairperson at that meeting. The  
19 department of transportation and the legislative fiscal bureau shall provide staff  
20 assistance to the committee.

21           **\*b0515/1.1\*** (3d) PORT ARTHUR ROAD EXTENSION IN CITY OF LADYSMITH. From the  
22 appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (eq) of the statutes, as affected by this act, the  
23 department of transportation shall allocate \$200,000 or 80% of the cost of the project,  
24 whichever is less, in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium to fund a project to close a portion  
25 of College Avenue in the city of Ladysmith and to extend Port Arthur Road east to

1     STH 27 in the city of Ladysmith, if the city of Ladysmith provides a local contribution  
2     toward the costs of the project in an amount equal to at least 20% of the cost of the  
3     project.

4           **\*b0819/1.1\*** (3e)   IMPROVEMENTS TO USH 51 IN CITY OF MADISON.  
5     Notwithstanding section 85.07 of the statutes, during the 2001–03 fiscal biennium,  
6     the department of transportation shall expend funds not to exceed \$300,000 from  
7     federal funds available under 23 USC 152 for a highway improvement project on  
8     USH 51 at the intersection of Rieder Road in the city of Madison in Dane County, if  
9     the project is consistent with the requirements of 23 USC 152 and regulations  
10    promulgated under 23 USC 152. The project shall include reconstruction of the  
11    southbound lanes of USH 51 at Rieder Road to incorporate a divided deceleration and  
12    turn lane on USH 51 for southbound traffic turning east onto Rieder Road from USH  
13    51 and a divided acceleration lane on USH 51 for traffic traveling west on Rieder  
14    Road turning south onto USH 51. The project shall also include installation of any  
15    traffic control signals necessary to allow traffic traveling west on Rieder Road to turn  
16    onto southbound USH 51 without requiring southbound traffic on USH 51 to stop.

17           **\*b1100/1.1\*** (3h) HANSON ROAD BRIDGE IN BURKE. Not later than December 31,  
18    2003, the department of transportation shall construct the Hanson Road bridge  
19    project in the town of Burke in Dane County and shall reconfigure Portage Road in  
20    the town of Burke to accommodate such construction.

21           (3k) AUTOMATED DRIVERS' LICENSE TESTING. The department of transportation  
22    shall conduct a study to determine whether to require automated drivers' license  
23    testing throughout the state and shall prepare a report containing its findings and  
24    recommendations. The department shall submit the report to the governor, and to

1 the legislature in the manner provided under section 13.172 (2) of the statutes, not  
2 later than June 30, 2003.

3 **\*b0600/1.1\*** (3mp) OVERPAYMENT OF STATE TRANSIT OPERATING AIDS.  
4 Notwithstanding section 85.20 (4m) (er) of the statutes, the department of  
5 transportation shall waive repayment by the city of Rhinelander of any outstanding  
6 balance of overpayments of state transit operating aids distributed by the  
7 department to the city for the calendar years 1997 through 1999.

8 **\*b1416/1.2\*** (3wy) HIGHWAY REST AREAS. The total amount of any proposed  
9 expenditures or encumbrances that the department of transportation does not make  
10 in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium as a result of the implementation of section 84.04 (4)  
11 of the statutes, as created by this act, shall be expended or encumbered by the  
12 department in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium to reopen previously closed rest areas or  
13 to keep open rest areas that are proposed for closure in areas where other rest areas  
14 and motorist services described in section 86.195 (3) of the statutes are not available.

15 **\*-0856/1.9152\*** (4) GRANTS TO LOCAL PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL STADIUM DISTRICTS.  
16 From the appropriation under section 20.395 (1) (gr) of the statutes, as created by  
17 this act, the department of transportation shall award grants in January 2002 to a  
18 local professional football stadium district created under subchapter IV of chapter  
19 229 of the statutes for the development, construction, reconstruction, or  
20 improvement of parking lots, garages, transportation facilities, or other functionally  
21 related or auxiliary facilities or structures on the site of the existing parking lot  
22 facility, of a football stadium, as defined in section 229.821 (6) of the statutes. Within  
23 30 days of receipt of the grants under this subsection, the local professional football  
24 stadium district shall provide all grant proceeds to the professional football team

1 described in section 229.823 of the statutes to be used by the professional football  
2 team for the purposes of the grants specified in this subsection.

3 **\*b0529/1.1\*** (4c) WAUSAU CITY SQUARE PARK PEDESTRIAN PATHWAY. In the  
4 2001–03 fiscal biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the  
5 statutes, the department of transportation shall award a grant to the city of Wausau  
6 for the project known as the City Square Park Pedestrian Pathway, if the city of  
7 Wausau contributes funds for the project that at least equal 20% of the costs of the  
8 project.

9 **\*b0533/1.1\*** (4d) HALFWAY CREEK BIKE TRAIL PROJECT. In the 2001–03 fiscal  
10 biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the statutes, the  
11 department of transportation shall award a grant to the village of Holmen for the  
12 project known as the Halfway Creek Bike Trail, if a person, other than the state,  
13 contributes funds for the project that at least equal 20% of the costs of the project.

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14 **\*b0804/2.4\*** (4k) SPARTA OVERPASS. In the 2001–03 fiscal biennium, from the  
15 appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the statutes, the department of  
16 transportation shall award a grant of \$496,000 to the city of Sparta in Monroe  
17 County for construction of a snowmobile–bicycle–pedestrian overpass over I 90 in the  
18 city of Sparta. The overpass shall be at least 14 feet in width and shall be located to  
19 provide convenient and safe access to the Elroy–Sparta State Trail, the La Crosse  
20 River State Trail, and nearby snowmobile trails.

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21 **\*b0840/1.2\*** (4e) CAPITOL COURT PROJECT. Of the amounts appropriated to the  
22 department of transportation under section 20.395 (3) (cq) of the statutes, as affected  
23 by this act, on the effective date of this subsection, the department shall allocate  
24 \$250,000 for preliminary engineering for and construction, reconstruction, or  
25 improvement of highways, transportation facilities, or other functionally related or

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1 auxiliary facilities or structures associated with the Capitol Court project on West  
2 Capitol Drive in the city of Milwaukee and for associated economic development.  
3 Notwithstanding section 20.001 (3) (c) of the statutes, if the department has not  
4 expended or encumbered any funds for the project on or before June 30, 2003, the  
5 funds allocated under this subsection shall lapse from the appropriation account  
6 under section 20.395 (3) (cq) of the statutes, as affected by this act, to the  
7 transportation fund.

8       **\*b1390/2.1\*** (4h) EISNER AVENUE PEDESTRIAN-BIKE TRAIL PROJECT. In the  
9 2001-03 fiscal biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the  
10 statutes, the department of transportation shall award a grant under section 85.026  
11 (2) of the statutes to the city of Sheboygan in Sheboygan County or the town of  
12 Sheboygan in Sheboygan County, or both, for the project known as the Eisner Avenue  
13 Pedestrian-Bike Trail Improvement project, if the recipient of the grant awarded  
14 under this subsection contributes funds for the project that total at least 20% of the  
15 costs of the project.

16       **\*b0530/3.1\*** (4nk) CLAYTON PEDESTRIAN FACILITY. In the 2001-03 fiscal  
17 biennium, the department of transportation shall construct a grade-separated  
18 pedestrian crossing of USH 45 in the town of Clayton in Winnebago County if the  
19 town of Clayton contributes funds for the project that at least equal 15% of the costs  
20 of the project.

21       **\*b2002/1.1\*** (4v) GRANTS TO BROWN COUNTY AND MUNICIPALITIES. From the  
22 appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (iq) of the statutes in fiscal year 2001-02, the  
23 department of transportation shall award grants under section 84.185 of the  
24 statutes, as affected by this act, totaling \$410,000 in January 2002 to Brown County,  
25 the city of Green Bay, and the village of Ashwaubenon to be used to pay costs

1 associated with the CTH “VK”/Lombardi Avenue project in the city of Green Bay in  
2 Brown County. Grant proceeds under this subsection shall be distributed in  
3 proportion to the percentage of the costs of the project to be borne by each local  
4 governmental unit. The provisions of section 84.185 of the statutes, as affected by  
5 this act, relating to the awarding of grants, the amount of grants, and the eligibility  
6 requirements for grants, including a required local contribution under section  
7 84.185 (2) (b) 5. of the statutes, do not apply to grants awarded under this subsection.

8 **\*b0650/2.2\*** (4x) MENASHA RECREATIONAL TRAIL. Notwithstanding limitations  
9 on the amount and use of aids provided under section 86.31 of the statutes, as  
10 affected by this act, or on eligibility requirements for receiving aids under section  
11 86.31 of the statutes, as affected by this act, the department of transportation shall  
12 award a grant of \$25,000 in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium to the town of Menasha in  
13 Winnebago County for the construction of a recreational trail along Cold Spring Road  
14 in the town of Menasha. Payment of the grant under this subsection shall be made  
15 from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (fr) of the statutes, as affected by this  
16 act, before making any other allocation of funds under section 86.31 (3) (b) of the  
17 statutes, and is in addition to the town of Menasha’s entitlement, as defined in  
18 section 86.31 (1) (ar) of the statutes, to aids under section 86.31 of the statutes, as  
19 affected by this act.

20 **\*b2004/1.3\*** (4z) IMPROVEMENT OF 85TH STREET IN KENOSHA COUNTY.  
21 Notwithstanding limitations on the amount and use of aids provided under section  
22 86.31 of the statutes, as affected by this act, or on eligibility requirements for  
23 receiving aids under section 86.31 of the statutes, as affected by this act, the  
24 department of transportation shall award a grant of \$609,000 in the 2001–03 fiscal  
25 biennium to the village of Pleasant Prairie in Kenosha County for improvements to

1 85th Street in the village of Pleasant Prairie. Payment of the grant under this  
2 subsection shall be made from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (fr) of the  
3 statutes, as affected by this act, before making any other allocation of funds under  
4 section 86.31 (3) (b) of the statutes, and is in addition to the village of Pleasant  
5 Prairie's entitlement, as defined in section 86.31 (1) (ar) of the statutes, to aids under  
6 section 86.31 of the statutes, as affected by this act.

7 **\*-2021/2.9152\*** (5) PARKING FACILITY GRANT. The department of transportation  
8 shall award a grant of \$420,700 to Kenosha County from the appropriation under  
9 section 20.395 (1) (bs) of the statutes, as affected by this act, in fiscal year 2001–02  
10 to provide 50% of the local share required for a congestion mitigation and air quality  
11 improvement project under section 85.245 of the statutes relating to a parking  
12 facility in the city of Kenosha. No grant may be awarded under this subsection unless  
13 Kenosha County makes a matching fund contribution toward the local share  
14 required for the project that is equal to the amount of the grant awarded under this  
15 subsection.

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16 **\*b2016/1.2\*** (5g) RAILROAD CROSSING IMPROVEMENT IN LADYSMITH. The  
17 department of transportation shall allocate \$480,000 in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium  
18 from the appropriations under section 20.395 (2) (gr) and (gx) of the statutes, as  
19 affected by this act, for the construction of an underpass under the railroad tracks  
20 on Phillips Street for the purpose of providing emergency vehicle access to the entire  
21 city of Ladysmith.

22 (5c) HIGHWAYS DESIGNATED FOR USE BY OVERSIZE VEHICLES. Notwithstanding  
23 section 348.07 (4) of the statutes, the secretary of transportation shall designate the  
24 following highways to which sections 348.07 (2) (f), (fm), (gm), and (gr) and 348.08  
25 (1) (e) and (h) of the statutes apply: STH 107 from CTH "A" in Marathon County to

1 STH 64 in Lincoln County, CTH “A” from STH 97 to CTH “K” in Marathon County,  
2 CTH “K” from Wausau in Marathon County to Merrill in Lincoln County, CTH “Q”  
3 from CTH “K” to USH 51 in Lincoln County, CTH “U” from STH 107 to USH 51 in  
4 Marathon County, and STH 97 from STH 29 in Marathon County to STH 64 in Taylor  
5 County. This subsection does not apply after June 30, 2003, or, if the secretary makes  
6 a determination before June 30, 2003, whether to designate the highways specified  
7 under this subsection under section Trans 276.07, Wisconsin Administrative Code,  
8 on the day after such determination.

9 \*b0815/2.1\* (5e) ASHLAND RAILROAD DEPOT. From the appropriations under  
10 section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the statutes, the department of transportation shall award  
11 a grant under section 85.026 (2) of the statutes of \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2002–03  
12 to the city of Ashland to be used to restore the historic Ashland railroad depot, if a  
13 person, other than the state, contributes funds for the restoration that at least equal  
14 20% of the costs of the restoration.

15 \*b1292/1.1\* (5v) BUS FOR TRANSPORTING THE ELDERLY. In the 2001–03 fiscal  
16 biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (1) (cq) of the statutes, the  
17 department of transportation shall allocate \$30,000 to award a grant to an eligible  
18 applicant under section 85.22 of the statutes for the acquisition of a bus to provide  
19 transportation services to the elderly in the village of Twin Lakes and the town of  
20 Randall in Kenosha County.

21 \*b0422/3.14\* (5w) MARQUETTE INTERCHANGE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT. From  
22 the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cr) and (cy) of the statutes, as created  
23 by this act, the department of transportation shall allocate \$160,643,900 in the  
24 2001–03 fiscal biennium, including \$75,150,000 in federal interstate cost estimate  
25 funds, for the Marquette interchange reconstruction project specified under section

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1 84.014 of the statutes, as created by this act. Except for the allocation of federal  
2 interstate cost estimate funds, the department may reduce the amount of any  
3 allocation under this subsection if allocating such amount would result in the loss  
4 of any federal highway funds. Funds from any allocation reduction under this  
5 subsection may be used to fund other southeast Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation  
6 projects. Funds allocated under this subsection for the Marquette interchange  
7 reconstruction project may not be used to fund interim repairs, as defined in section  
8 84.014 (1) (a) of the statutes, as created by this act.

9 **\*b0422/3.14\*** (5x) REQUEST ON SOUTHEAST WISCONSIN FREEWAY REHABILITATION.

10 By the date specified by the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for the  
11 submission of requests for consideration at the next quarterly meeting of the  
12 committee under section 13.10 of the statutes occurring after the effective date of this  
13 subsection, the department of transportation shall submit a request for the transfer  
14 of moneys from the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cq), (cv), and (cx) of the  
15 statutes, as affected by this act, to the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cr),  
16 (cw), and (cy) of the statutes, as created by this act, to allocate funds for rehabilitation  
17 of the southeast Wisconsin freeways. The department's request, and the committee's  
18 action on the request, may not include funding allocated for projects in other parts  
19 of the state or other funding that is not allocated to rehabilitation of southeast  
20 Wisconsin freeways.

21 **\*b0422/3.14\*** (5y) REQUEST ON WEST CANAL STREET RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

22 FUNDING. Notwithstanding section 16.42 (1) of the statutes, the department of  
23 transportation shall include in its 2003–05 biennial budget request to the  
24 department of administration a request for a grant of not more than \$5,000,000, to  
25 be funded from Indian gaming receipts, as defined in section 569.01 (1m) of the

1 statutes, if additional funds are needed in the 2003-05 fiscal biennium to complete  
2 the West Canal Street reconstruction project specified under section 84.03 (3) of the  
3 statutes, as created by this act. If a request for additional funding is made under this  
4 subsection, the request shall include a recommendation for statutory changes  
5 needed to require the city of Milwaukee to make a matching contribution equal to the  
6 amount of the grant to be awarded by the department of transportation in the  
7 2003-05 fiscal biennium.

8 **\*b2000/1.1\*** (5yq) STATE TRUNK HIGHWAY 15/45 LOCATION STUDY AND  
9 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT. Notwithstanding section 13.489 (1m) of the  
10 statutes, the department of transportation shall allocate \$200,000 in fiscal year  
11 2001-02 from the appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (bq), (br), and (bx) of the  
12 statutes to conduct a location study and an environmental assessment for an STH  
13 15/USH 45 highway project from Greenville to New London in Outagamie County.

14 **\*b0245/2.1\*** (5z) COMPUTERIZED INFORMATION SYSTEMS.

15 (a) The department of transportation shall study, and prepare a report on, the  
16 department's computerized information systems and the department's plan for  
17 utilizing its data processing resources, including the use of those resources for  
18 database redesign for the division of motor vehicles. In preparing its report under  
19 this paragraph, the department of transportation shall consult with the department  
20 of electronic government, as created by this act. The department of transportation  
21 shall include in the report recommendations concerning the potential benefits of  
22 coordinating data processing resource planning among other state agencies. By the  
23 date specified by the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for submission  
24 of requests for consideration at the 4th quarterly meeting of the committee under

1 section 13.10 of the statutes for the 2001–02 fiscal year, the department shall submit  
2 the report to the committee for review and approval.

3 (b) Notwithstanding section 16.50 (1) of the statutes, as affected by this act, and  
4 section 16.50 (2) of the statutes, of the moneys appropriated to the department of  
5 transportation under section 20.395 (5) (cq) of the statutes for fiscal year 2002–03,  
6 the secretary of administration may not waive submission of expenditure estimates  
7 and may not approve such estimates as to \$2,000,000 for departmental data  
8 processing resources, including division of motor vehicles database redesign, and for  
9 study by a consultant of the department's computerized information systems and  
10 information technology needs, unless the joint committee on finance approves the  
11 report submitted under paragraph (a). As part of its approval of the report, the  
12 committee may transfer any portion of the \$2,000,000 to the appropriation account  
13 under section 20.395 (4) (aq) of the statutes, as affected by this act, for the purpose  
14 of conducting a study, by a consultant, of the department's computerized information  
15 systems and information technology needs.

16 \*b0672/2.1\* (6b) BUSINESS SIGNS IN KENOSHA COUNTY. Notwithstanding the  
17 eligibility criteria established under section 86.195 of the statutes, upon application  
18 and payment of fees ordinarily required for the mounting of business signs, the  
19 department of transportation shall mount business signs meeting the specifications  
20 under section 86.195 of the statutes, and rules promulgated under that section, for  
21 Tenuta's Delicatessen and Liquors, located in the city of Kenosha in Kenosha County.  
22 The business signs shall be mounted on the specific information signs on I 94  
23 approaching the interchange at I 94 and 52nd Street in Kenosha County. The word  
24 "liquor" may not appear on a business sign mounted under this subsection.

1           **\*b0800/1.1\*** (6bg) STH 100 RECONSTRUCTION. Not later than June 30, 2003, the  
2 department of transportation shall begin reconstruction of that portion of STH 100  
3 between STH 32 and STH 38 in Milwaukee County.

4           **\*b0487/2.1\*** (6d) TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS IN GRANTSBURG. Not later than June  
5 30, 2003, the department of transportation shall install traffic control signals at the  
6 intersection of STH 48 and STH 70 in the village of Grantsburg in Burnett County.

7           **\*b0486/2.1\*** (6dd) TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS IN SPOONER. Not later than June  
8 30, 2003, the department of transportation shall install traffic control signals at the  
9 intersection of USH 63 and West Beaver Brook Avenue in the city of Spooner in  
10 Washburn County.

11           **\*b1302/2.2\*** (6dg) STREETLIGHT IN LITTLE FALLS. Not later than June 30, 2003,  
12 the department of transportation shall install a streetlight at the intersection of STH  
13 27 and STH 71 in the town of Little Falls in Monroe County.

14           **\*b0490/1.1\*** (6e) WAYLAND ACADEMY. Notwithstanding section 86.19 (1) of the  
15 statutes, the department of transportation shall erect directional signs along USH  
16 151 in the vicinity of STH 33 for Wayland Academy located in Beaver Dam in Dodge  
17 County not later than June 30, 2003.

18           **\*b0803/1.1\*** (6pp) SIGNS IN WALWORTH COUNTY. Not later than June 30, 2003,  
19 the department of transportation shall erect signs along I 43 approaching the city of  
20 Delavan in Walworth County identifying the downtown area of the city of Delavan  
21 as a "Historic Downtown" and providing directional information to the "Historic  
22 Downtown."

23           **\*b0817/1.1\*** (6x) TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS IN OAK CREEK. No later than June  
30, 2003, the department of transportation shall install traffic control signals at the

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1 intersection of STH 38 and Oakwood Road in the city of Oak Creek in Milwaukee  
2 County.

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3 **\*b0821/1.1\*** (6q) SIGNS IN MARATHON COUNTY. Not later than June 30, 2003, the  
4 department of transportation shall erect 2 signs, one for each direction of travel,  
5 along STH 29 in Marathon County, and 2 signs, one for each direction of travel, along  
6 STH 107 in Marathon County. Each sign shall identify and provide directional  
7 information to the area that is commonly known as "Little Chicago" and shall be  
8 erected near the highway exit providing the most direct route from the highway to  
9 the area that is commonly known as "Little Chicago."

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10 **\*b1282/3.1\*** (6h) SIGNS FOR THE CLEAR LAKE ALL VETERANS' MEMORIAL AND  
11 CEMETERY. Notwithstanding s. 86.19 (1) of the statutes, the department of  
12 transportation shall erect 2 directional signs along USH 63 in the Clear Lake region  
13 in Polk County for the Clear Lake All Veterans' Memorial and Cemetery not later  
14 than June 30, 2002.

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15 **\*b1291/2.1\*** (6s) SIGNS IN MILWAUKEE COUNTY. Not later than 60 days after the  
16 effective date of this subsection, the department of transportation shall erect 2 signs,  
17 one for each direction of travel, along I 43/894 approaching the 60th Street exit in the  
18 city of Greenfield in Milwaukee County, providing directional information to  
19 downtown Greendale.

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20 **\*b1295/2.1\*** (6r) TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS IN WEST SALEM. Not later than  
21 December 31, 2001, the department of transportation shall install traffic control  
22 signals at the intersection of STH 16 and Brickl Road in the village of West Salem  
23 in La Crosse County.

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24 **\*b0531/1.1\*** (7d) RULES FOR HARBOR ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. In the 2001-03 fiscal  
25 biennium, the department of transportation shall amend any rules that have been

1 promulgated to administer the harbor assistance program under section 85.095 of  
2 the statutes to specifically provide that a facility that is used by a ferry service or  
3 cruise ship constitutes a commercial transportation facility for purposes of  
4 determining eligibility under the program.

5 **\*b2007/2.9\*** (7q) REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES FUNDING. At  
6 the 4th quarterly meeting of the joint committee on finance under section 13.10 of  
7 the statutes in the 2001–02 fiscal year, the department of transportation may submit  
8 to the committee a request for the transfer of moneys not to exceed \$10,000,000 from  
9 the appropriation under section 20.395 (3) (cq) of the statutes, as affected by this act,
