TOPIC: This change in statutory authority would require DOT to permanently reissue license plates every six years (beginning July 1, 2006) for autos and trucks registered at 8,000 pounds and under.

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

DOT would reissue license plates every six years following the proposed initial plan to reissue plates from July 1, 2000 - June 30, 2005. This provision assumes the six year reissue cycle will begin July 1, 2006 and should be effective with enactment of the budget. The reissue period should take place over six years so that DOT replaces license plates in these categories when individual plates reach six years old.

JUSTIFICATION:

A consistent replacement cycle for license plates will assure the department addresses concerns related to aging plates that may be difficult for law enforcement and others to read.

- * the Governor Office is comfortable with our extending the rebase period from 5 yr to 9 yr, per our recommendation
- * the proposed language for DOT discretion suggested below relating to when to rebase plates is **NOT** acceptable. Statutory language changes will need to be year specific; 5 yr rebase cycle extended to 9 year rebase, and 6 year new design cycle extended to 10 year new design, etc.

FYI I got a call from Peggy Hurley yesterday, asking how we want the draft to eliminate the 5-year rebasing requirement. I suggested she draft it to repeal all of 341.135 mandating DOT to rebase plates, since the decision to reissue is budget-driven.....I told her if our bosses feel that's not politically feasible, we'll ask her to change it to "DOT required to reissue at a time determined by DOT" after we review the draft.

I am partially vetoing the section to delete the reporting date because the department needs additional time to conduct this study due to the delayed budget enactment and limited departmental resources. Instead, I am requesting the department to submit the study by June 30, 2001.

Governor's written objections

These sections require the Department of Transportation to develop new license plate designs by July 1, 2000, and every sixth year thereafter for motor vehicles. In addition, the department is required to begin issuing license plates with a new plate design over a five-year period, beginning with registrations effective July 1, 2000, for regular automobile plates and several other plate types.

I am partially vetoing the provisions for license plate design and reissuance to delay the requirement to redesign the plate because it limits the department's flexibility. While it is important we proceed with the replacement of aging or faded plates, the public has been divided on the design for a new plate. I request the Department of Transportation proceed with the five-year replacement schedule using the current plate design. When a new design has been selected, the department will substitute that design and establish a new design every sixth year thereafter. This will allow the department to begin replacing the oldest plates but still require that a new plate design be developed. Furthermore, a regular permanent replacement cycle is retained in the statutes.

Current law imposes a ^{six} 6-year redesign cycle for motor vehicle registration plates, by the end of which DOT must redesign the plates that are issued to certain specified vehicles. The redesigned plates are primarily for automobiles and light ^{duty} trucks or for specialized registration plates for authorized groups, such as disabled persons, persons with military background, ^{or} supporters of the ^{University} ~~University~~ of Wisconsin System, or persons with special hobby interests and activities.

Under current law, DOT must issue redesigned plates upon every initial vehicle registration and upon every registration renewal if the vehicle's plate is more than ^{six} 6 years old. The first ^{six} 6-year cycle will be completed by July 1, 2005, and DOT will have provided redesigned plates to every vehicle by that date, with one exception. Current law prohibits DOT from redesigning or reissuing the "Celebrate Children" plates until January 1, 2005. After that date, DOT may redesign and issue the redesigned "Celebrate Children" plates upon initial registration or renewal.

This bill creates a ^{ten} 10-year redesign cycle and extends the reissue deadline for each category of registration by four years. The bill requires DOT to wait until

Karen: This is the DMV final decision for you to send to Carol Buckmaster for her to send to LRB. As we discussed yesterday when we met with you, we need to get several changes to the LRB draft 0019/1 which changes the reissuance term to a 9-year cycle.

(1) We have decided that the *reissuance* and the *design* cycles should coincide -- instead of a 9-year reissuance within a 10-year design cycle. The reason is that, for the long-term, a stable, continuing reissuance program with funding that is part of the DMV base budget is what the Legislature intended for a regular reissuance cycle, and is effectively what we are budgeting for....We will be able to gear up for each succeeding reissuance cycle during the last year or so of the 9-year reissuance period and do not need a "year off" to design a new plate look.

Therefore, several changes to the draft are needed:

- 1. Page 2, line 2: change "10th" to "9th" ✓**
- 2. Page 2, line 9: change "10-year" to "9-year" ✓**
- 3. Page 2, line 11: change "10-year" to "9-year" ✓**
- 4. Page 2, line 14: change "January" to "July" ✓**
- 5. Page 3, line 13: change "10" to "9" ✓**
- 6. Page 3, line 15: change "10-year" to "9-year" ✓**
- 7. Page 4, line 5: change "January" to "July" ✓**

(2) Intent of current law is that Sesquicentennial plates are not to be reissued at all during the first reissuance cycle (beginning July 1, 2000). This prohibition is removed for subsequent reissuance cycles by rescinding the paragraph after the end of the first reissuance cycle.

Therefore, we need to stick with current law, regardless of increasing the reissuance cycle to a 9-year cycle. The following change is needed:

Page 3,lines 24-25: Remove the strikeout so as to retain current law.

(3) Finally, LRB may wish to revise the analysis to conform to the corrected statutory language.
