10. Animal Health "Related Services"

Explanation:

The department currently has an animal health "related services" appropriation under s. 20.115(2)(g), Stats. The department deposits, to this appropriation, authorized payments received for animal health services that the department provides at the request of service users.

The department formerly deposited animal health lab fees to this appropriation, and spent the fees up to the amount authorized in the schedule. 1999 Wis. Act 107, which transferred state animal health labs from the department to the University of Wisconsin, left the appropriation account intact but transferred the appropriation balance to the UW and reduced the spending authorization (schedule amount) to \$0.

Although DATCP no longer operates the state animal health labs, it has a continuing need for the animal health "related services" appropriation (to handle other authorized animal health service payments). DATCP proposes to convert the appropriation from an annual to a continuing appropriation.

DATCP currently offers voluntary training courses for veterinarians and other persons who issue fish health certificates under s. 95.60, Stats. DATCP proposes to clarify its authority to charge fees to recover the cost of training. DATCP proposes to deposit the fees to its "related services" appropriation under s. 20.115(2)(g), Stats.

Statutory Changes:

SECTION ___. 20.115(2)(g) of the statutes is amended to read:

20.115(2)(g) *Related services.* ~~The amounts in the schedule~~ All moneys received for the conduct of services related to service fees. All moneys received for such service fees as are authorized by law shall be credited to this appropriation. All moneys received under s. 95.60(8) shall be credited to this appropriation.

[NOTE: The schedule designation for the above appropriation should also be changed from "A" to "C".]

SECTION ___. 95.60(8) of the statutes is created to read:

95.60(8) The department may offer training for veterinarians and other persons who issue fish health certificates under this section. The department may charge fees to recover its cost to provide the training. The department shall deposit the fees to the appropriation under s. 20.115(2)(g).
